> This is the fifth newsletter on the progress of the EU funded Twinning Project 'Strengthening the Capabilities of the Department of Statistics in Jordan'

During the previous three months, thirteen activities were implemented.

The overall progress of the project is good and many tangible results have been achieved due to the high commitment from DoS as well as the MS experts.

The nine remaining activities will be implemented during the last two months of the Twinning project, which will end by the end of April 2015. At that time, 52 activities will have been implemented compared to the 47 activities initially planned.

Also at this stage, the remaining five benchmarks out of the total 22 are well on the way to be achieved.
