Conclusions - strenghts

- NSSRA has experience on the production of the R&D data
- Quality declaration of the R&D statistics is based on the Eurostat's Code of Practice
- NSSRA has a good co-operation with the stakeholders in the field of STI statistics regarding the user needs
- Business register is available as a basis for innovation survey





Conclusions – issues for improvement

- R&D statistics of the NSSRA covers currently only Government and Higher Education sectors
- No data on R&D or Innovations on the Business sector
- International guidelines partly implemented

For the comparability with other countries need to improve and extend the production



Recommendations

- Recommendation to implement the OECD and Eurostat methodologies and quality standards
- To fully follow Frascati manual (R&D) and Oslo manual (innovation) guidelines in surveys
- To implement European harmonized model questionnaire with national data needs for survey of enterprise innovation activities





Roadmap for the next mission in February 2016

- For experts of the NSSRA to study carefully the three main documents delivered by the consultants (the innovation model questionnaire, notes to the questionnaire and methodological recommendations)
- Adequate resources for the pilot survey reserved
- Good co-operation with the business register and other enterprise statistics divisions ensured
- Possibilities of the online questionnaire examined





Roadmap for the next mission in February 2016

- Clarification of the national data needs in collaboration with the stakeholders (such as The Committee of Science) to be added to the model questionnaire
- Preliminary list of questions for the pilot questionnaire prepared (also in English) to be finalized in the February mission
- To prepare information on the target population of the enterprises for consultants to provide guidelines on the sampling issues
