





Data sources not currently available to ICBS on adult education

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After having described the available data on non-formal adult education, this document seeks to describe additional data sources on adult education which are not currently available to ICBS. These are:

- Initial education for adults
- Institutions for adult education supervised by the Ministry for Senior Citizens ("leisure study")
- *Ulpanim* language learning classes for immigrants
- Professional auxiliary education seminars ("Hishtalmuyot" or continuing education)

What many of these programmes have in common is that they are operated by the authorities and organizations that determine the policy, either directly or through the educational institutions. Usually, the government ministries are the ones involved in financial decisions, in funding, in developing curricula, and in the supervision aspect.

Initial education for adults supervised by the Ministry of Education

The Adult Education Department at the Ministry of Education runs a variety of programmes aimed at closing educational gaps among the adult population in Israel. These educational programmes may target specific population groups: people in prison, soldiers, Ethiopian immigrants, Arabs, Bedouin and elderly people who did not complete their initial education at a younger age. These projects are run in co-operation with, and sometimes co-funded by, other agencies and ministries such as the Ministry of Agriculture, the Ministry of Defense, the Association for the Education of Adults.





The programmes run by the Adult Education Department cater for people who have an education below 10 years of schooling. There are three main programmes:

- 1. Pre-basic Equivalent to 1st-2nd grades of primary education
- 2. Basic education level Reading and writing at basic level + elementary addition
- 3. 11th-12th grades programme Intensive track

Two additional programmes allow the learner to receive a certificate which is equivalent to upper secondary graduation:

- 1. Partial Matriculation programme (10 units), entitles the learner to a final 12-years-of-schooling certificate. Run in co-operation with the Foreign Relations and UNESCO Department.
- 2. Programme for those who finished 11 years of schooling 600 hours of general or combined general-vocational hours.

In total there are some 4,000 examinees per year, and about 800 receive an upper secondary graduation certificate.

The Department does not have data on the number of students in these tracks, but rather of those taking the final examinations.

The data of the Adult Education Department examinees is not currently part of ICBS' statistics. It represents a unique element in the educational landscape in Israel, inter alia for being an interesting example of a non-formal programme (due do its alternative nature and especially its short length) leading to a formal, recognized qualification.

These days the Department is expected to send their identified microdata of the above described programmes, after the administrative formal process for obtaining them has finalized.

Institutions for adult education supervised by the Ministry for Senior Citizens

Educational programmes under the supervision of the Ministry for Senior Citizens, intended for the general educational enrichment of the adult person, not towards a formal qualification. There are no entry requisites for these classes, which are 15 to 100 hours long. Most courses are 60 hours long.





ICBS currently receives pre-calculated counts of students, which are annually published by ICBS as provided (see Annex A). The lack of an administrative file with individual records and ID numbers makes is impossible for ICBS to make basic quality controls of the data.

Ulpanim - language learning classes for immigrants

The Ulpan institutions (Ulpanim) are operated in conjunction by the Ministry of Education's Division of Adult Education, the Ministry of Immigration Absorption, the local authority, the Jewish Agency, Joint Israel, colleges, community centers and the IDF (Israeli Defense Forces). These institutions impart to the immigrants a mastery of the Hebrew language, as well as other skills that promote their integration into the Israeli society and job market.

The Ulpan studies are conducted in two levels: basic and advanced. The Basic Ulpan is conducted throughout five months (500 hours). In the advanced classes (160 hours), contents change according to necessity: professional Hebrew for the vocational groups; job hunting workshops; and language improvement.

ICBS currently receives pre-calculated counts for Ulpan students and classes, which are annually published by ICBS as provided (see Annex B). The lack of an administrative file with individual records and ID numbers makes is impossible for ICBS to make basic quality controls of the data, not to mention merging with other sources for research purposes.

Professional auxiliary education seminars ("Hishtalmuyot" or continuing education)

The auxiliary education bonuses that are given in the public sector according to set criteria serve as an important incentive for adult education. Since it is necessary to accumulate a certain amount of continuing education hours in order to receive this bonus¹, large numbers of public sector employees are continually engage in these courses, which are imparted by a large variety of providers, mostly private institutions. Many of these courses are very short, starting at about 40 hours each, 100 hours being the most common length.

No data exist in ICBS on these seminars.

Continuing education courses for teachers – The Ministry of Education is responsible for continuing education for teachers. About 7,000 courses are run every year, of which 4,500 by the Ministry's initiative, and the rest by institutions which received the Ministry's approval. Each year, about 130,000 certificates are issued to the learners.

No data files are currently available from this source, but since it's under the Ministry of Education's responsibility, it is rather plausible to expect having access to this data source in the near future, as opposed to other types of continuing education, where regulation is weak and the providers are a very wide range of private institutions.


