Status at the beginning of the project

- NSSRA did not collect earnings data on individual employees
- NSSRA had a monthly survey concerning wages on enterprise level
- NSSRA had an annual survey concerning labour costs on enterprise level
- NSSRA had limited contact with their users and stakeholders



Status of project results (SES)

- Thorough discussion of the regulation concerning Structure of Earnings Survey, which collects information about earnings on individual employees.
- Conducted a Pilot Structure of Earnings survey where the results will be published in June to show what possibilities a full scale survey can give.
- For the majority of the project NSSRA tried to get access to the State Revenue Committee of RA's database, as this would mean that individual data on a large scale could be used instead of the pilot survey. Currently it seems that the collaboration with State Revenue Committee is improving and NSSRA maybe soon will get access to data



Status of project results (LCS)

- Thorough discussion of the regulations concerning Labour Costs.
- The current annual labour cost survey were evaluated and it was concluded, that it is almost as according to EU-legislation. NSSRA has to look into a few variable to see if they are applicable for Armenia and a few suggestions to the questionnaire was made.
- For the collecting period NSSRA has expressed a desire to reduce the survey to only be conducted every 2nd or 3rd year, if they get access to the State Revenue Committee's database



Status of project results (LCI)

- NSSRA is currently working on calculating the Labour Cost Index and it will be publish before the end of July.
- NSSRA has been trained using Demetra, so they can seasonally adjust the Labour Cost Index
- NSSRA has held several stakeholder meetings with a large number of participants. The participants have been active and came with questions and comments and recommendations every time.



Sustainability of the achievements (SES)

- NSSRA should still work on getting access to the State Revenue Committee's database, so they will not have to increase the burden by collecting the next structure of Earnings Survey themselves for the year 2018.
- In case access is not granted in time NSSRA has to start preparing collecting data themselves.
- When the next Structure of Earnings Survey is ready to be published it is important to make some event to make the users aware of this new statistic.





Sustainability of the achievements (LCI + LCS)

- NSSRA should work on making the Labour Cost Index on single economic activity as well as the current aggregated level. This will increase the value of the index and the possibility that the users will start to use this index.
- The Labour Cost Survey is already an integrated statistics in NSSRA. As NSSRA is planning on changing the frequency it is important to keep users informed about this change
- To keep on the cooperation between stakeholders and NSSRA it is recommended that NSSRA at least once a year has a stakeholders meeting with Labour Costs and Earnings as the theme



Recommendations for the future (short and long term) (SES)

- Produce a Structure of Earnings Survey at least every 4th year
- Work on getting access to the State Revenue Committee's database
- Depending on variables in the database and their quality NSSRA should consider maybe adding a questionnaire to complement the database
- If access is not granted NSSRA will have to develop their own questionnaire based on the experiences for the pilot study





Recommendations for the future (short and long term) (LCS + LCI)

- Continue publishing Labour Cost Survey at least every 4th year
- Considering the changes suggested to the questionnaire
- Add individual NACE sectors to the Labour Cost Index
- For all collected variable it is important to keep searching for administrative sources instead of collecting data by questionnaire
- Keep having stakeholders meeting to have a platform for constructive dialogue about the statistics



Identification of needs for additional support

- In case the NSSRA get access to the State Revenue Committee's database we believe that NSSRA would benefit from support from a country that like NSSRA are using administrative data for the structure of earnings survey.
- The support should focus on:
 - Validation
 - Imputations
 - Corrections
 - Handling data and constructing the requested variables based on the available variables





Outstanding issues

- At the time being the pilot SES will be published before the end of June 2017
- LCI will be published before the end of July 2017
