## 1 Introduction

The purpose of the statistics is to describe the yearly opening hours and the number of visitors to Zoos, Aquariums and Botanical gardens. The statistics has been compiled since 1985.

## 2 Statistical presentation

Visitors and yearly opening hours to the different types of zoos and each individual zoo, aquarium and botanical garden. The statistics have been revised in 2016

### 2.1 Data description

The statistics show the number of zoos and botanical plants, their visits and annual opening hours. In addition, if the facility receives state aid or not.

### 2.4 Statistical concepts and definitions

Visitors: The visitors are persons who physically visited the zoo / botanical garden. It is not decisive whether the ticket has been issued in connection with visits. If there are systematically record of number of visitors, provide an estimate. Number of visitors is calculated in visitors in total and children / young people under 18 with and without learning content.

Opening hours: Annual opening hours.

Zootypes: It distinguishes between three types of zoos:

- zoo which is state-subsidized according to the zoo-law
- Other state-supported
- Non-state-supported

The population is botanical and zoological gardens and nature reserves.

## **3 Statistical processing**

The statistic is annually. The data is collected through electronic questionnaires. The collected data is validated by comparing this years numbers with the former numbers. If a zoo have large fluctuations in the number of visitors from one year to the next, Statistics Denmark contact the facility to get a clarification. Data is aggregated and if some zoo's haven't answered the questionnaire data from last year gets imported.

### **3.4 Data validation**

When a zoo or a botanical plants have large fluctuations in the number of visitors from one year to the next, contact the facility to get a clarification. Result prioritized according to the size in terms of number of visitors. In the electronic questionnaire is controls, so the reporter can relate to to fluctuations in visitor numbers, when reporting. In addition, check for changes in annual opening hours.

Data is corrected for non-response but no grossing up is made. Tabulation to the StatBank Denmark.

## **5 Accuracy and reliability**

The statistics are compiled on the basis of (in principle) all zoos, aquariums and botanical gardens, but some non state-subsidized zoo do not answer the questionnaires. There will be the a low number of visitors for non state-subsidized zoo or gardens. State-subsidized zoo or gardens have a good coverage.

### **5.1 Overall accuracy**

The survey is voluntary. Some non- state-subsidized zoos or botanical gardens decline to report to the investigation. All state-subsidized zoo and major non- state-subsidized units report the statistics every year. There are no uncertainty calculations, but the number of visitors to non- state-subsidized zoos or botanical gardens is too low. This will have an impact on the overall number of visitors. Only few and easily accessible information is requested and therefore there is no measurement errors.

### **5.2 Sampling error**

There is no sample.

### **5.3 Non-sampling error**

Reporting to the statistics for zoos and botanical gardens is voluntary. Therefore some smaller zoos and botanical gardens choose not to report to the statistics. The large units report annually.

### **5.4 Quality management**

Statistics Denmark follows the recommendations on organisation and management of quality given in the Code of Practice for European Statistics (CoP) and the implementation guidelines given in the Quality Assurance Framework of the European Statistical System (QAF). A Working Group on Quality and a central quality assurance function have been established to continuously carry through control of products and processes.

### **5.5 Quality assurance**

Statistics Denmark follows the principles in the Code of Practice for European Statistics (CoP) and uses the Quality Assurance Framework of the European Statistical System (QAF) for the implementation of the principles. This involves continuous decentralized and central control of products and processes based on documentation following international standards. The central quality assurance function reports to the Working Group on Quality. Reports include suggestions for improvement that are assessed, decided and subsequently implemented.

## **5.6 Quality assessment**

The survey is voluntary. Some smaller non state-subsidized zoos or botanical gardens refuse to participate. All state-supported zoos participate. On the website of Statistics Denmark there is an Excel spreadsheet containing information about individual zoos or botanical gardens.

## **5.7 Data revision - policy**

Statistics Denmark revises published figures in accordance with the [Revision Policy for Statistics Denmark](#). The common procedures and principles of the Revision Policy are for some statistics supplemented by a specific revision practice.

## **5.8 Data revision practice**

Only final statistics is published.

## **6 Timeliness and punctuality**

The statistics are published annually approx. 4 months after the reference period.

### **6.1 Timeliness and time lag - final results**

Only final figures is published.

### **6.2 Punctuality**

The time of publication was delayed by one and half month in 2021.

## **7 Comparability**

Comparability concerning number of visitors is possible from 1984 onwards at the level of the individual zoo, aquarium and botanical garden. At the aggregated level there is a certain level of uncertainty due to an increase of the population; especially in the period 2009 - 2011.

### **7.1 Comparability - geographical**

There are not known to internationally comparable figures in the field.

### **7.2 Comparability over time**

Comparability concerning number of visitors is possible from 1984 onwards at the level of the individual zoo, aquarium and botanical garden.

2021, as well as 2020, is affected by COVID-19.

### **7.3 Coherence - cross domain**

Museum statistics also measures the number of visitors and the annual opening hours, but no comparisons between these statistics is made.
