

Documentation of statistics for Names 2016



1 Introduction

The statistics concern the names of newborn babies and the whole population in Denmark at 1st January by first name and surname.

The statistics were established in 1995, at first undertaken as a project for the Department of Name Research at Copenhagen University. The statistics were first published in 1995 and were based on the population of newborn children in 1993.

Today, data concerning names are published biannually. In January lists concerning the whole population are published and in July lists concerning the newborn babies the previous year are published.

2 Statistical presentation

The statistics concerning names are split up into two different statistics. One concerns the whole population in Denmark at 1st January by first name and surname. The other concerns names of newborn babies.

The statistics are based on the first name. Hyphenated first names are considered as one name. Names, which can be spelt in several different ways, are included with the most popular spelling in the given year.

2.1 Data description

The statistics concerning names are split up into two different statistics. One concerns the whole population in Denmark at 1st January by first name and surname. The other concerns names of newborn babies.

The statistics are based on the first name. Hyphenated first names are considered as one name. Names, which can be spelt in several different ways, are included with the most popular spelling in the given year.

The basis for the statistics is data from the Central Population Register (CPR).

2.4 Statistical concepts and definitions

Surname: The surname used in the statistic is the surname written in the Central Population Register.

First name: The first name in use in the statistic, is the first first name written in the Central Population Register. If there is a hyphen between two first names, the names are considered as one first name.

2.5 Statistical unit

The statistical unit is people.

2.6 Statistical population

The number of children born in a given year. In the statistics concerning names the newborn babies must be resident in Denmark at 1st July of the previous year in order to be covered by the statistics.

2.7 Reference area

Denmark.

2.8 Time coverage

The statistics concerning first names of newborn babies date back to 1985. 30th June is the time of reference for the statistics concerning first names for newborn babies.

The statistics concerning names for the whole population date back to 1986. 1st January is the time of reference for the statistics concerning first names and surnames for the whole population.

2.9 Base period

Not relevant for these statistics.

2.10 Unit of measure

The unit of measure is people.

2.12 Frequency of dissemination

The statistics are published yearly.

5.5 Quality assurance

Statistics Denmark follows the principles in the Code of Practice for European Statistics (CoP) and uses the Quality Assurance Framework of the European Statistical System (QAF) for the implementation of the principles. This involves continuous decentralized and central control of products and processes based on documentation following international standards. The central quality assurance function reports to the Working Group on Quality. Reports include suggestions for improvement that are assessed, decided and subsequently implemented.

5.6 Quality assessment

The statistics are based on the Central Population Register (CPR). The quality of the data is very high.

5.7 Data revision - policy

Statistics Denmark revises published figures in accordance with the <u>Revision Policy for Statistics</u> <u>Denmark</u>. The common procedures and principles of the Revision Policy are for some statistics supplemented by a specific revision practice.

5.8 Data revision practice

Only final figures are published.

6 Timeliness and punctuality

The statistics concerning names for the whole population is published app. 15 days after the end of the year.

The statistics concerning names of newborn babies are published app. 6½ months after the end of the year, as we have to wait for their baby names, which must be given up to 6 months after the baby was born.

6.1 Timeliness and time lag - final results

Only final figures are published.

6.2 Punctuality

The statistics are usually published without delay in relation to the scheduled date.

7 Comparability

From 1996 the statistics concerning names includes all people living in Denmark. Before 1996 the statistics concerning names only included Danish citizens living in Denmark.

The statistics concerning names are internationally comparable.

From 1996 the statistics concerning names includes all people living in Denmark. Before 1996 the statistics concerning names only included Danish citizens living in Denmark.
