


Introduction


Link between session 2B and current session

- ⇒ The importance of non-resident groups in the total number of employed persons
- ⇒ Essential in a strong migration context

36921 -1%




Summary statistics, labour market

Complementary information with **no supplementary survey costs**


Generally no construction at microdata level


Main adaptations:

- Adaptation of the LFS results to the domestic concept (also relevant for national accounts)
- Addition of breakdowns
- Addition of periodic results



Summary statistics, labour market





Dissemination, un-/employment statistics


Mixed dissemination in the quarterly SLFS press release: Combination of information from the LFS, the ES and the unemployment statistics

Text:

- Absolute headcount + FTE + seasonally adjusted from the ES
- Seasonally adjusted headcount from the unemployment statistics
- Part-time and underemployed from the LFS (trend and rates)


Tables:

- Employed persons according to the ES and LFS
- => Explication of the definitions used and concepts covered



Use, limits and challenges

- Frequent revisions
 Revision of sources (often not at the same time)
 Modification of sources
- Non-harmonised definitions
- Lower number of variables and level of detail
- Recourse to hypotheses
 Are they (still) correct?



Matching SESAM: "extended" LFS

Concept:


- 1st important linkage project of survey and adm. data
- Linkage of LFS with different social insurance registers

Application, use:

 Enables to broaden analyses (health, income, retirement, unemployment)

Limits and challenges:

- Common identifier
- Documentation of metadata



Current trends


More requests for LFS microdata linked with other sources

Reasons:

More possibilities due to standard identifiers More self data analysis
