 Statistics Denmark produces impartial statistics on society as the basis for democracy and the national economy


Vision with four elements:

- 1973: Denmark joins the EU

- 2014: Statistics Denmark on Twitter









 6 members with insight into social
 - 6 members with insight into social and economic conditions
- · Decide on annual work programme
- Approve the budget
- Advisory users committees (9 at present)
- National Statistician (Director General)
 Manager of Statistics Denmark
- The Minister of Economic and Internal Affairs
 Annual budget and parliamentarian responsibility





- Mission
 - discuss the users' need for statistics
 - evaluate the statistical program
 - evaluate quality, documentation and dissemination
- Members
 - ministries and the central bank
 - organisations
 - research institutes
- Frequency and agenda
 - twice a year
 - members are urged to contribute

- Surveys and interviews
 - always needed




- It is cheap
 - when the administrative sources exist
- No response burden
- Total population coverage
 without non-response
- Data quality may be outstanding








- With a survey you start with the questions and you must find the answers
- With registers you have the answers and must estimate the needed variables
- You are dependent on administrations
 - data breaks
 data breaks













- Public authorities must supply information
- *Private* businesses must supply information within the legal framework
 - Act on Statistics Denmark
 - · EU legal acts
 - Non-compliance is sanctioned
- Individuals have no obligations

- 10 permanent staff
- 60 trained interviewers
- No field staff
- CATI Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing
- CAWI web
- Customers include private companies, researchers and public institutions

>> Online access to micro data

- Only for researchers and analysts from authorized research and analysis environments
- Special servers separated from the statistical production
- The de-identified micro data (individuals and businesses) remain at Statistics Denmark
- · Outputs with statistical results are forwarded by e-mail
- Strict data security measures and severe sanctions if the rules are not complied with

- Also countries farther away from Europe: Sudan, Mozambique, Tajikistan and Kazakhstan




