#### 1. General comments

This mission report was prepared within the EU Twinning Project "Further Support to the Reform of the Statistics System in Bosnia and Herzegovina". It was the first mission to be devoted to assessment of the current status of availability and use of administrative data and the way forward within Component 3 of the project.

The purposes of the mission were:

- Assessment of the current status of availability and use of administrative data
- Development of work plan
- Preparation of ToR for next activity

The consultants would like to express their thanks to all officials and individuals met for the kind support and valuable information which they received during the online meetings, and which highly facilitated the work of the consultant.

#### 2. Assessment and results

The first mission was attended by representatives from the Agency for Statistics of Bosnia and Herzegovina (BHAS), Institute for Statistics of Republika Srpska (RSIS) and Institute for Statistics of Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FIS). They all represented more or less business and economic statistics. In the first meeting we gathered background information, discussed on the current situation and the experiences and challenges encountered in using administrative sources for statistical purposes. We also discussed on the needs and objectives for the content of the current project.

In our discussions, all participants of different statistical institutes (BHAS, FIS, and RSIS) expressed a strong willingness to increase the use of the administrative sources for statistical compilation. During the meetings, we were presented the expectations and wishes for the future work within this action and the workplan was made based on this conversation.

In the previous project "Support to the reform of the statistics system in Bosnia and Herzegovina", the first inventory of administrative sources in different statistical domains was made. In order to obtain the current situation regarding the use of administrative data for statistics, it was agreed that each statistical institution would take care of updating the data collected earlier (excel lists). Due to the relatively broad scope of the statistical domains and the need for participants to organize the work in their own agencies, it was agreed that the work would be given time until the end of September. The procedure for verifying (and where relevant updating) the large amount of information was also discussed and subsequently agreed upon.

We discussed the candidates for pilot testing, i.e. which specific statistics we will examine in more detail. It was suggested that one pilot could be selected STS indicators using VAT data as a main data source as most participants are related to this statistical domain and good prospects for the relevant administrative source exist. Following the update of the existing inventory and subsequent discussion we will decide on the second pilot. The experts recommended that the other pilot should be from the domain of social statistics. However, the final decision of the selected pilot statistics and corresponding data sources will be selected later in this autumn.











During the mission, a tentative project plan (Annex 3) was planned and agreed as well as the content of the next mission that we hope can happen in the first week of November. If travel restrictions allow the next activity will be conducted as an on-site mission.

#### 3. Conclusions and recommendations

BHAS, FIS, and RSIS all indicated a strong will in moving towards increased use of register data for statistical purposes. Currently traditional production systems with many paper questionnaire etc consumes many resources and impose a high response burden for both enterprises and population. It is hoped that this burden will be reduced by increasing the use of administrative registers. However, this is not easy, and before the goal is achieved, many challenges will have to be faced and resolved.

The following issues came up in the discussions:

- Better know-how of using administrative sources: Possibilities and challenges
- Co-operation, e.g. data sharing between statistical institutes and between statistical institutes and ministries/data owners
- Methodology and quality framework for register-based statistics

These issues could be promoted through, for example, training and workshops.

It was agreed that the current inventory on administrative data sources in BiH will be updated by the end of September. Project members of BHAS will contact the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina and ask them to go through and update their part of the inventory. The next mission was primarily scheduled to the beginning of November 2021, but are postponed until week 8 or 9 in 2022 due to availability of experts respectively beneficiaries. The purpose of the mission is to identify new relevant sources of administrative data at different levels of government. During this mission, the experiences on the use of administrative data of MS countries as well as BC country will be presented.
