#### Introduction



#### The need of welfare statistics:

According to the recommendations of the guide of national accounts – SNA2008

The need of information of welfare

The need of information of welfare expenditure by type of service.

To understand the structure of the system of welfare, in terms of operating and financing sector.

The trend of privatization of welfare services can be tracked and quantified.

### **Definitions**



- -The definitions of the sectors are by the SNA2008
- -The welfare account includes detailed data on income and expenditure.
- -The tables present a matrix showing a cross-classification of financing and performing sectors.

## **Definitions (cont.)**



Decisions of the steering committee on building welfare account, in accordance with the first mission report:

- -The forum has decided that it is better to use the SOCX basis (9 fields) which is the widest basis.
- It was decided that health data should not be included in the satellite account
- -it was recommended not to include pensions payments the decision is yet to be discussed

### **Methodology**



The Methodology which guided us in building the welfare account for the government sector was the Classification Of the Functions Of Government (COFOG). The COFOG classification is well organized

and divided to second level classifications of sub-function.

## Social protection function of COFOG

10.8	R&D social protection- was not included since it is included in the R&D satellite account

## **Government sector**



Welfare expenditure and finance in Government includes - Ministries, Local Authorities, National insurance, Public non-profit institutions and National institutions.

#### Data sources:

Data is based on COFOG classification which was received from the government division of the Macro-Economics department.

## Government sector (cont.)



#### Data sources:

<u>National Insurance Institute-</u>The data is based mainly on the annual and quarterly reports of the National Insurance Institute.

Most of the detailed data was received on paper, therefore major efforts had to be made to computerize it into our database in 2009.

The data is classified by SNA and GFS codes, by type of benefit (cash or in kind), by policy area and by program.

## Government sector (cont.)



#### Data sources:

Local authorities and national institutions-The data is obtained from the analyses of financial reports.

The expenditure is classified by SNA and GFS, by type of benefit (cash or in kind), by policy area and by program.

## Government sector (cont.)



#### **Assumptions:**

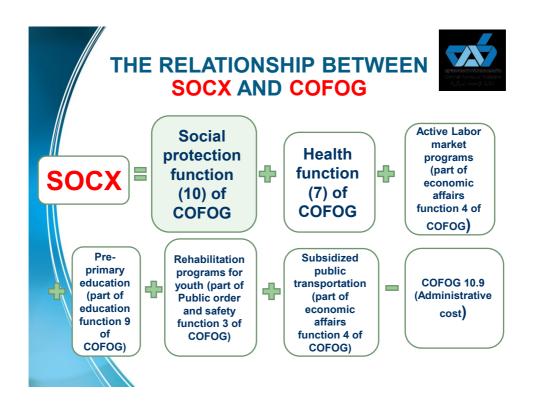
- -labor training and labor programs were not included in the COFOG data, therefore, were added to the government data.
- National institutions are not included in the COFOG data, therefore, were added to the government data.
- -Rehabilitation benefits and security includes parts which relate to health. In our current analysis we treated the whole amount as welfare.

## **Government sector** (cont.)



#### **Assumptions:**

- -Pensions were excluded from the tables ,should be considered if it should be included or not.
- Pre-primary education data was not included in the COFOG data therefore was added to the government data.



## Public non-profit institutions sector



#### Data sources:

<u>Public non-profit institutions-</u> ongoing survey by our sector: conveyed every second year. Can be performed each year (since 2011).

The population of the survey was 1,742 for 2011, and the sample consisted 275 non-profit institutions (public and private).

#### **Business sector**



<u>Welfare in the Business sector</u> – currently conveyed as a part of the survey of trade and services, by the department of Business.

The population of the survey for welfare brunches 87, 88 in 2011 was 4,040 companies, and the sample consisted of 250 companies.

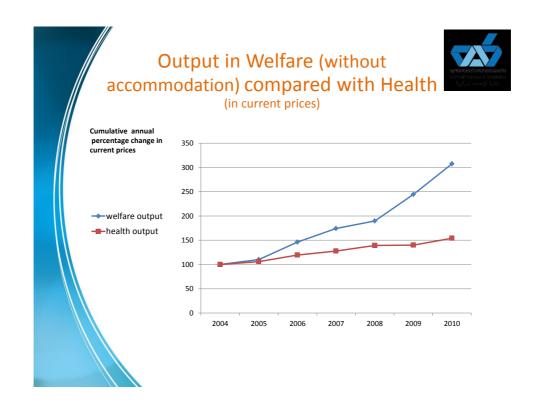
We need a complementary survey for building a satellite account – more detailed income and expenditure of welfare private institutions, and number of patients and employees in each group.

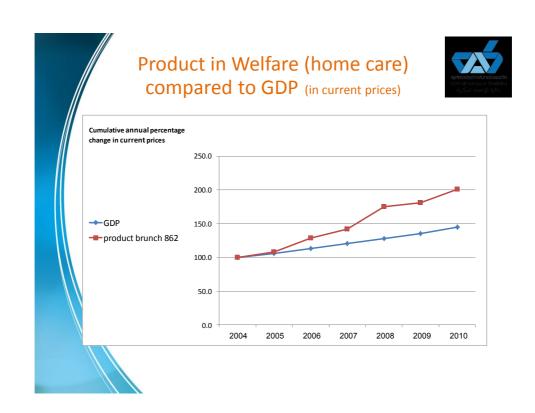
#### Business sector (cont.)



#### Assumptions-

The financial reports of businesses in the Trade and Services survey do not include detailed Information about type of income (NII, government, private sector, etc.)-therefore we assumed that 40% of the income is coming from the private sector (households).

## Private non-profit institutions



<u>Data sources</u>- an ongoing survey conducted by the social services sector: every second year. Can be performed each year (since 2011).

The population of the survey was 1,742 for 2011, and the sample consisted 275 non-profit institutions engaged in welfare (public and private).

## Non-profit institutions-public and private



The population of the survey included all non-profit organizations in Israel, who were economically active in 2011. This population included non-profit organizations from 11 main fields of service (one of them was welfare), including subdomains. The distribution to 11 fields and the definitions of activities which were included in each field, were based on the International Classification of fields of activity of Non-Profit Organizations (ICNPO).

The preparation of the non-profit institutions Satellite Account, as was done by the CBS, was based on the analysis of financial reports. The reports were taken from the Guide-Star website or copied from the tax authority. The CBS does not apply to the non-profit institutions directly.

## Non profit institutions-public and private



 Human resources in NPIs dedicated to Welfare, by sector of performance, by occupation, education and gender: Survey conducted by the Israeli center of Philanthropy in the Hebrew University of Jerusalem – (just started) conducted by Prof. Hillel Shmid in collaboration with ICBS. Data on employees and patients will be gathered through this survey.

## Options for International Comparisons



- Welfare expenditure as percent of GDP.
- Welfare expenditure per Capita.
- Welfare expenditure by sector of performance and type of service (or purpose).
- Welfare expenditure by sector of finance.
- Human resources dedicated to welfare, by occupation, education and gender.
- Distribution of welfare expenditure by type of service (child care, women etc.).
- Expenditure per clients based on the number of clients in each group (data to be collected through questionnaires).

### Challenges



- Extension of the current available sources of data: income by type, in the business sector.
- To display series of National expenditure on welfare in current and <u>constant</u> prices
- To calculate more indicators
- to display international comparisons
