#### 1. General comments

This mission report was prepared within the Twinning Project "Strengthening the capabilities of the Department of Statistics in Jordan". It was the fifth and sixth mission to be devoted to national accounts within Component 1 of the project.

The main purposes of the mission were:

- To continue the manual balancing process by eliminating as many product imbalances as possible
- To train the DoS staff so they during active balancing work become familiar with the balancing technique and with the common "Rules for balancing"
- To make plans for further work and agree upon work to be done before next mission scheduled December 2014.

The consultants would like to express their thanks to all DoS officials and individuals met for the kind support and valuable information which they received during their stay in Jordan and which highly facilitated their work.

The views and observations stated in this report are those of the consultants and do not necessarily correspond to the views of EU, DoS or Statistics Denmark.

## 2. Assessment and results

At the end of the fourth mission we have reached a milestone in the project with the fulfilment of an initial SUT ready for manual balancing. This means that all available data has been utilized, NA-product coded and saved in the SUT.

Despite this very fine result, when compared with the original plans, this is however slightly behind schedule. Fortunately we have been able to respond to the delay by extending this mission with an extra expert and in this way to cover two activities.

All local DoS-participants engaged in the project were looking forward to learn about the balancing work. Some of them had a chance to train before the mission and everybody showed a lot of enthusiasm in the work. Some of them prepared themselves by:

- 1. Studying the note "Balancing the SUT" or "والاستخدام العرض جداول توازن
- 2. Doing exercises with the EXCEL SUT IT-tool.
  - Trying to retrieve products (rows)
  - Trying to retrieve production or intermediate consumption or other parts of the use table (columns)
  - o Trying to figure out what the figures show
    - Why don't the products balance?
    - Looking specifically at products with strange values (e.g. uses outside inventory changes) or large differences between initial values for supply and use and try to find explanations (e.g. missing supplies or uses, erroneous coding of supply or use components, improbable distribution of taxes on products, errors in source data)

In order to meet the Terms of Reference for this fifth (and sixth) mission devoted entirely to manual balancing of the SUT, we initially supplied everybody with a note on balancing techniques, see "Rules for balancing" Annex 4 and one of the experts examined the main rules for balancing in plenary.

The experts had also made plans for the organization of the balancing work: a division of balancers' responsibilities concerning NA-products as well as a division of balancers' responsibilities concerning targets for production, intermediate consumption and other aggregates — all according to the descriptions and recommendations in the note "Balancing the SUT", distributed in an earlier mission.

These plans were presented again for discussion and adoption and then we could start working in three different groups by the desks. Each group consisted of 2-3 DoS-persons and one of the experts to coach.

The rest of the time – around three and a half working days – we concentrated on job training by the desks. Finally, in plenary, we went through the outstanding imbalances and agreed upon work to do before the next mission: which of the remaining NA\_products in imbalance should be eliminated by the Dos-Staff and which of the remaining NA\_products in imbalance should be eliminated by the experts.

## 3. Conclusions and recommendations

This mission concentrated on the manual balancing of the SUT. The mission was extended with an extra expert and covered two activities. This was very successful because we in this way addressed specifically the capacity building concerning different balancing techniques. We also dealt with many issues concerning the Jordanian economy and we managed to balance around 200 of 250 products.

Next step is to address the balancing towards target totals in the mission in the beginning of December. The goal is to complete this part of the balancing process within the next mission and leave the final (more automatically) balancing procedure to a final mission in mid-January.

If this plan is going to succeed, before next mission, the rest of the product-imbalances have to be eliminated.
