## Preface

The publication *Danish Input-Output Tables and Analyses 2007 - Imports, Employment and Environment* is primarily designed as a practical reference guide presenting data and in particular analytical results (impact multipliers) on the structural characteristics and developments of the Danish economy. Readers who are not familiar with the theoretical aspects of input-output analysis may still benefit from the contents.

In the different chapters of the publication a comprehensive treatment of the basic data material is given together with figures primarily for the year 2005, which is the most recent year for which final national accounts and input-output tables are available. This part is followed by the multipliers, some of which have also been "forecasted" to the year 2007.

The Danish input-output tables are available free of charge on the Internet. There are two different ways of downloading input-output data from Statistics Denmark's homepage. Firstly, [www.statbank.dk](http://www.statbank.dk) offers the possibility of extracting either complete tables or sections of the input-output tables in the same way as other data are extracted from StatBank Denmark. Secondly, [www.dst.dk/inputoutput](http://www.dst.dk/inputoutput) provides users with the possibility of downloading entire sets of input-output tables, investment matrices, energy matrices and emission matrices for analyses in Excel, GAMS, Gauss or SAS.

For other national accounts figures readers are referred to the latest edition of the annual publication (in Danish) *Nationalregnskab* which contains final figures consistent with those of the present publication for 2005, and preliminary figures for 2006 and 2007. Readers are also referred to Statbank Denmark at [www.statbank.dk](http://www.statbank.dk), where time series of national accounts figures are accessible, with both Danish and English headings.

This publication has been prepared in the national accounts division of Statistics Denmark by Consultant Tim Folke and Senior Adviser Peter Rørmose. Poul Erik Olesen translated the original Danish text into English in 2004.

## Forord

Formålet med publikationen *Danish Input-Output Tables and Analyses 2007 - Imports, Employment and Environment* er først og fremmest at fungere som et praktisk opslagsværk, der kan gøre beskrivelsen af en række strukturelle forhold i økonomien samt analyseresultater i form af import-, beskæftigelses-, energi- og emissionsmultiplikatorer tilgængelige også for brugere, der ikke har særlig metodeindsigt på disse områder.

I de enkelte kapitler gives der en redegørelse for det grundlæggende datamateriale illustreret med tabeller fortrinsvis for 2005, der er det seneste år for hvilket der er udarbejdet endeligt nationalregnskab. Det er derfor også dette år, der fortrinsvis er dækket i de detaljerede analyser. Enkelte tabeller er summarisk fremskrevet til 2007.

De danske input-output tabeller er gratis til rådighed på internettet. Der er to forskellige muligheder for at downloade input-output data fra Danmarks Statistikks hjemmesider. For det første kan man på [www.statistikbanken.dk](http://www.statistikbanken.dk) udtrække enten hele tabeller eller præcis det udsnit af tabellerne man ønsker, på samme måde som man kan trække øvrige data fra statistikbanken. For det andet kan man på [www.dst.dk/inputoutput](http://www.dst.dk/inputoutput) downloade hele sæt af input-output tabeller, investeringsmatricer, energimatrimer og emissionsmatricer til brug for beregninger i Excel, GAMS, Gauss eller SAS.

Hvad angår det samlede nationalregnskab henvises til nyeste udgave af *Nationalregnskab*, der indeholder endelige tal frem til og med 2005 samt foreløbige tal for 2006 og 2007. De der offentliggjorte tal er konsistente med tallene i nærværende publikation. Der henvises endvidere til [www.statistikbanken.dk](http://www.statistikbanken.dk) hvor nationalregnskabsdata er til rådighed.

# 1. Introduction

## 1.1 Purpose of the publication

*A practical reference book*

The present publication is primarily intended as a practical reference book, which may be instrumental in making the present data material and analytical results accessible to users with no special insight into the methodology involved in preparing national accounts, supplementary data systems, e.g. concerning employment and energy, and input-output tables or the underlying theory of constructing input-output models.

*Input-output method is not explained*

The design of the present publication as a practical reference book is another reason for leaving out all methodological explanations of how to construct input-output tables. For the same reason mathematical formulas are neither used here nor in the description of how to interpret multipliers.

*Publication is divided into subjects*

The present publication is divided into the main categories input-output tables, environmental accounts (NAMEA), production, employment, energy and emission analyses.

*Data and multipliers are described in each chapter*

In the introduction to each chapter, importance is attached to providing a basic description of the data types or multipliers in question, focusing special attention on problems of interpretation and on any pitfalls.

## 1.2 National accounts statistics and input-output data

*National accounts statistics give a comprehensive picture*

The aim of the national accounts statistics is to give a comprehensive picture of the national economy by describing production, formation of income, distribution of income, redistribution of income and capital accumulation in accordance with the principles laid down in the system for national accounts. The description may be more or less detailed with respect to the groupings (e.g. number of industries) into which society is divided. Irrespective of the level of detail it is an essential quality of the national accounts data that they are mutually consistent and comparable over time.

*Input-output tables describe the production structure*

An input-output table describes in detail the production structure in society and the use of goods and services. Subsequently, the table can be seen as a further specification of the 3 main accounts of the national accounts, namely accounts for goods and services, production and income formation respectively. Consequently, input-output tables are an integrated part of the national accounts statistics and are consistent with the national accounts data over each year as well as over time.

*Input-output tables form the basis for a model*

The reason why input-output tables have a special position in relation to other national accounts data is that special conditions apply to constructing input-output tables within the framework of the system for national accounts. This should again be seen in relation to the quality which attracts attention to the input-output tables, i.e. they can immediately be applied as a basis for a specific type of economic models known as the input-output model.

*Supplementary data systems increase the number of uses*

There is a considerable increase in the analytical potentials of the input-output tables combined with supplementary data systems that are consistent with the structure of the tables, in the sense that they have, at least for one dimension, a classification in common with the input-output tables.

*Data used here are for employment, energy and emissions*

In this publication, the supplementary data systems used in the calculations comprise data on employment, energy and emissions, which in conjunction with input-output tables form the basis for the input-output models used in conducting structural analyses. The data on energy and emissions are described in detail in chapters 7 and

8, whereas the data on employment are briefly described in chapter 6 and in greater detail in Danish in the publication *Nationalregnskab 2007*.

*Data available for the period 1966-2005*

In the context of the old national accounts based on ESA79, product balances were available for the period 1966-1992. In the new Danish national accounts compiled in accordance with ESA95, product balances were only available for the years 1988-2000. A revision of data has since changed the starting year to 1990. Input-output tables for 1966-1989 have been prepared as part of the work on extrapolating the new and revised national accounts back to 1966. These input-output tables are not based on product balances, but are converted from such tables in accordance with ESA95, with classifications corresponding to the tables for 1990-2000. The first set of ESA95 tables are ESA79 tables adjusted to the new set of classifications and also adjusted with respect to the differences between ESA79 and ESA95 as well as with respect to the changes implemented in the data sources and calculation methods over the period 1988-1996. Furthermore, 2000 is now base year for the calculations at constant prices, though chained data are now seen as the best indicators of development. The investment matrices were constructed in the spring of 2001 for the period 1993-1997, later for 1998-2000, and later still in the autumn of 2003 in connection with completing the national accounts 2000. These have also been subject to the revision of data needed to keep them consistent with the rest of the national accounts and are now available for 1993-2005.

*Calculations for the years 1975-2005 with special emphasis on 2005*

The principal contents of this publication are made up by describing the structure of the input-output table and by using the input-output model for estimating a number of aggregates, which monitor the structure of the national economy in 2005 and structural trends over the period 1975-2005. For a description of the general national accounts statistics, please see the publication *Nationalregnskab 2007*.

### 1.3 Overview of the publication

*Generally*

Chapters 2-8 begin with an introductory text section, followed by a table section. Chapters 2-3 contain mainly an outline of the data used in the subsequent calculations of shares and multipliers.

*Input-output table in chapter 2*

*Chapter 2* describes the structure of the input-output tables, and some conditions of relevance to their use as basis for constructing input-output models are discussed. Aggregated input-output matrices with 26 industries are used to illustrate the construction. Special attention is focused on how imports are treated in the tables and on some aspects of special interest in connection with input-output tables at constant prices. The chapter also contains tables of the same type with a breakdown of groups containing private consumption as well as capital formation by industries.

*NAMEA in chapter 3*

*Chapter 3* describes how the environmental-economic accounts are summarized into one single table in accordance with the principle of NAMEA (National Accounting Matrix including Environmental Accounts), and an aggregated version of the table is also shown. The environmental-economic accounts represent an extension of the input-output table in chapter 2, as information on energy consumption, energy reserves and air emissions is added to the information on the economic structure in the input-output table.

*Introduction to analytical tables in chapter 4*

*Chapter 4* begins with an introductory explanation of the subsequent chapters, and some information common to the chapters is outlined. A number of aggregated multiplier tables are shown together with some tables compiled on the basis of the analytical multiplier tables. Similar to previous chapters, a biennial extrapolation of the aggregated multiplier tables is conducted - here from 2005 to 2007 – on the basis of some simplified assumptions.

Chapter 4 contains some aggregated multiplier tables for 2005 of central importance, as they offer access to the other types of multiplier tables appearing in the present publication. Firstly, access to the extrapolated table for 2007, whose structure is completely identical to the above tables. Secondly, access to the detailed tables in chapters 5-7, which contain, generally speaking, multipliers of the same type, but further divided with respect to the criteria concerning the heading and front column of the tables. Thirdly, access to the time series of multipliers in chapters 5-7, which are identical to the multipliers in the 6 columns contained in the summary table. At the moment, the time series in these chapters most frequently only cover 9 years, i.e. a few years in the period 1975 – 2000 and 2001 – 2005, but most of them have been extrapolated back to 1966. Owing to consideration of space the time series are only compiled at the level of aggregation in the summary tables.

*Multipliers  
in chapter 5*

*Chapter 5 shows detailed multipliers for primary factors (imports, indirect taxes and factor income) for the year 2005. The table types 5.C and 5.F.2 in the previous publications in Danish are maintained as continuous types in this chapter. The time series of import multipliers called 6.C in the previous publication are also continued in this chapter.*

*Chapter 6 deals with  
employment*

*Chapter 6 contains tables on employment. Subsequently, the detailed 5.D tables, table 5.F.1 and some time series of the type 6.D in the previous publication are maintained as continuous tables and time series in this chapter.*

*Energy is described  
in chapter 7*

*Following a description of especially the conversion from actual energy consumption to gross energy consumption, chapter 7 contains the previous publication's detailed tables of type 5.E and of the time series 6.E, which are continued in this chapter. The data in the tables, which are only based on information on energy, are revised forward to 2007.*

*Air emissions are outlined  
in chapter 8*

*Chapter 8 contains tables on the relationship between economic activity and emissions of various gases, which have an impact on the surrounding environment. In this chapter, the times series cover the years 1990, 1995, 2000 and 2004 – 2007.*

*Classification  
in appendices 1 and 2*

*Appendix 1 shows a summary of the industrial classification in the national accounts (and thereby the classification of the input-output tables) and the relationship of this classification with the Danish Industrial Classification of All Activities 2003 (based on NACE, Rev. 1.1). The appendix also shows the relationship between the 130 groups in the most detailed grouping and the 2 standard aggregations containing, respectively 53 and 27 industry groups, and which in the context of the national accounts have respectively 52 and 26 industries. Appendix 2 shows a summary of the 72 groups of private consumption expenditure, supplemented by a group comprising consumption expenditure of non-profit institutions.*

*Definitions and glossary  
in appendix 3*

*Different concepts are explained in appendix 3. Most of them are well-known to economists, but other users may find the explanations useful.*

## 1.4 Data availability

*Free data  
on the internet*

All Danish input-output and national accounts data are now available for free on the internet. From [www.dst.dk/inputoutput](http://www.dst.dk/inputoutput) it is possible to download all the Danish input-output data from 1966 through the most recent year. The matrices are available in Excel, Gauss, GAMS as well as the SAS file formats. At [www.statbank.dk](http://www.statbank.dk) input-output data can be extracted according to the users own choice. Either sections of the tables or complete tables can be downloaded for a single year or in time series.

Other national accounts data can be downloaded from [www.statbank.dk](http://www.statbank.dk).

## 2. Input-output tables

### 2.1 Introduction

<i>Input-output table</i>	An input-output table describes in detail the production structure and use of goods and services in society. Consequently, the table can be seen as a further specification of the three general accounts for goods and services, production and income formation, which are part of the national accounts.
<i>Rows in the table</i>	The presentation in this section is related to table 2.1, which is an aggregated edition (26 industries) of the endogenous version of the detailed input-output table (130 industries).
<i>Columns in the table</i>	The rows in an input-output table show the way in which production and primary inputs (i.e. imports, indirect taxes, net and factor incomes) are used, partly for input in industries and partly for final use (i.e. consumption expenditure, capital formation and exports, etc.).
<i>The sum of a row is equal to the sum of a column</i>	A column for an industry shows how the value of the production of an industry is made up by the consumption of raw and auxiliary materials (distributed by Danish production and imports), indirect taxes, net and compensation of the production factors, partly as compensation of employees and partly by gross operating surplus and mixed income. A column for a final use represents the composition of Danish production, imports and indirect taxes, net.
<i>Figures in the table are almost estimated at basic prices</i>	For each industry, the sum of a row and the sum of a column are identical and equal to the value of the industry's production.
<i>Purchaser's prices can also be derived from the table</i>	Production and imports by industries are estimated at basic prices (imports, including customs duties), implying that other indirect taxes, net and trade margins (production value at basic prices by the distributive trades) are distinguished in specific rows. The advantage of this is that pricing in a row is not affected by variations between uses of trade margins and indirect taxes.
<i>Basis of the input-output table</i>	Although, basic prices make up the general concept of value in the table, there is sufficient information for estimating intermediary consumption of raw and auxiliary materials at purchaser's prices by industry, which is derived by adding taxes on products, net <sup>1</sup> and non-refundable VAT on inputs by industries, to the sum of supplies from domestic industries (including the distributed trade margins) and imports.
<i>Energy balances</i>	The basis for constructing the input-output table is formed by the product balances of the final national accounts for about 2,350 commodities and services. On the supply side production in (normally a few of) the 130 industries and imports are distinguished. On the demand (use) side a distinction is made between input into 130 industries and 14 main groups of final use, of which private consumption expenditure is further broken down on 73 groups. When the national accounts are reconciled, supply and use (at basic prices) are identical for each product. The primary inputs comprise imports, indirect taxes, net and compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income.
	About 40 of the product balances mentioned above relate to energy commodities. They are distinguished from other balances in that they partly make up a distinct system of reconciliation, and partly are estimated as values, physical quantities and calorific values. This has proved to be necessary, as there may be great variations in the average price for the same energy type among each type of use. Consequently, estimated values do not form an adequate basis for conducting analyses of trends in calorific values, quantities and derived environmental impacts.

<sup>1</sup> For practical reasons the designation "taxes on products, net" is used in the input-output table. In the context of standard terminology, this concept embraces "net taxes on products, excl. VAT and taxes on imports".

*Method applied in  
constructing the table*

The input-output table is methodologically based on the recommendations in UN's System of National Accounts (SNA 1968). The table is known as an industry-by-industry table<sup>2</sup>, which is estimated on the assumption of industry technologies. In the paper on the national accounts entitled *Commodity flow systems and construction of input-output tables in Denmark*<sup>3</sup> (Working paper no. 15, Statistics Denmark 1986), the primary data and method of constructing the former input-output tables are described in detail. A more recent edition of UN's system exist (SNA 1993), which is reasonably reconciled with the version for the European Communities (ESA 1995). The latter version forms the basis for compiling the Danish national accounts. However, there are some inaccurate and unpractical input-output recommendations in ESA 1995, and in consequence of this it was decided to generally continue constructing the input-output tables in accordance with the former methods.

*FISIM*

The previous method of simultaneously including a sane measure of the production by banks and not counting interest as factor income led to the invention of a nominal industry FISIM (financial intermediation services indirectly measured), that produced nothing but used the interest differential within financial intermediation as input. This practise has now been abandoned, and the payments of interest differential have been estimated. Such payments by other than industries are accepted as part of factor income. It should be mentioned that this has made foreign trade of FISIM possible.

*The edition shown is  
highly aggregated*

The tables shown in this chapter are all generally of a summary character (26 industries and 14 main groups of final use) in relation to the level of detail at which the input-output tables are actually available (130 industries and, e.g. 73 groups of private consumption expenditure). The argument in favour of showing the summary tables only is partly due to reasons of space and partly to obtain a greater overview of the structure in the input-output matrix and of the relationship between them. Furthermore the detailed tables, which are made directly available to users on different edp media, are usually preferred for analytical uses, as aggregation errors in the results are thus minimized.

## 2.2 Processing of imports

*Value level of imports*

The definition of basic prices for imports is given in ESA 95 as their value c.i.f., see appendix 3. Throughout this publication imports are estimated, inclusive of customs duties and other taxes on imports, as it must be assumed that imports compete with domestic production at this value level, where the most homogeneous prices among the two types of supply can be found. This is essential if meaningful information is to be shown in table 2.3.

*Imports are aggregated  
or distributed  
as Danish production*

Table 2.1 shows all imports by products in a single row. However, it may be useful to distribute information on imports by commodity groups, which can be further transformed to "industry groups", as each imported commodity at the commodity group level of 2350 is equally distributed to "industries" proportionally with domestic production of the commodity in question. In cases where there is no domestic production of a commodity, an industry code based on the nature of the commodity is allocated to imports. Against this background, it is thus possible to compile imports by industry as shown in table 2.2. Some specific categories of imports, e.g. direct supplies from rest of the world for oil and gas activities in the North Sea, expenditure of Danish ships abroad, expenditure on tourism cannot be classified by product or by industry, but are distributed to a group that could be called "non-specified external transactions".

<sup>3</sup> The paper describes the compilation at current and constant prices in the input-output tables in accordance with former international definitions. However, the description is still of relevance with respect to most areas..

*Aggregation of Danish production and imports*

As imports shown in table 2.2 are available in a grouping similar to Danish production in table 2.1, the two tables can be added element-by-element in this area, when the row showing imports by product in table 2.1 is set at zero. An input-output table where this row is set at zero is shown in *table 2.3*. With respect to industries, it is usually preferable here that the sum of a row is equal to the sum of a column, which is achieved if an additional final use creates a column, where imports by commodity are negatively classified (the column showing total figures from table 2.2). However, this is omitted for reasons of space from the table shown.

*Exogenous and endogenous model*

The two different ways in which to construct the input-output table as illustrated by means of tables 2.1 and 2.3 have some important bearings on their use as primary data for the input-output models. The impact on imports of any given changes in the final demands can be analysed on the basis of table 2.1, where imports appear as a primary input in the table. On the other hand, the interaction among domestic industries hinges on the current relations with respect to imports, and can consequently be considered to be of a behavioural character rather than of a technical character. Conversely, the input structure shown in table 2.3 is independent of whether the raw materials used originate from domestic or foreign suppliers, and an input structure of a technical character is therefore, to a higher degree, shown by the table. On the other hand, this table cannot alone form the basis for a model, which allows for estimating the content of imports by industry. These differences are therefore the reason why the two table types – anticipating their use as models – are described as tables with endogenous imports (table 2.1) and exogenous imports (table 2.3).

*Private consumption distributed by domestic and foreign suppliers*

A further breakdown of private consumption to 11 main groups is shown in *table 2.4*. Similar to the previous tables data on Danish production and imports are first shown separately, and then they are shown as aggregated data. However, they are here presented as an alternative tabulation within the framework of a single table.

## 2.3 Input-output tables at constant prices

*Also input-output tables at 2000 prices*

All previously mentioned tables related to the year 2005 in current prices. However, there are also input-output tables converted to the prices of a specific base year (for the time being 2000 prices). Similar to the tables with figures in current prices, the tables with figures at constant prices are consistent with the figures in the national accounts.

*and the prices of the previous year*

In order to facilitate the calculation of national accounts data as chained values, which are now regarded as better indicators of volume developments than the above mentioned fixed price data, the product balances are also deflated to the prices of the previous year. So input-output tables starting with the table for 1967 are also calculated in the prices of the previous year. These tables are based on product balances, starting with the table for 1991.

*No distribution of earnings and residual income*

As separate calculations at constant prices are not made for other production taxes, compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income, this distribution is not included in the tables showing figures at constant prices, but only total gross value added for each industry.

*Constant price-calculations*

The methods applied in calculating constant prices are outlined in Working paper no. 15, cf. above, which also contains a description of how calculation methods influence the qualities of the tables as basis for the input-output models. In this context, it is emphasized that deflation in itself can be regarded as a calculation with the characteristics of a model. It should be noted that the input-output table at constant prices is not calculated on the basis of the table in current prices, as identical methods from the detailed product balances of the national accounts at constant and current prices, respectively are applied in producing both tables.

*Input-output table is regarded as a description of quantities*

An input-output table is primarily regarded as a description of physical or technical relations, implying that a time series of input-output tables at constant prices is consequently the most relevant basis for describing these relations over time. To this is added that the distribution of single elements to quantity and price components, which is the result of deflation, can in itself provide information of interest on the economic structure as well as on the realism of the assumptions that are usually inherent in analytical uses.

*Prices in the table rows should be homogeneous*

Attempts are, in principle, made to achieve a homogeneous valuation in each table row, so that a value unit of the commodity can be assumed to be equivalent to the same physical quantity, irrespective of the industry or final use in which the quantity is used. Assuming that a homogeneous valuation existed at the most detailed commodity level in the product balances of the national accounts (which is, in practice, not the case, see the chapter on energy balances), this quality would not be maintained throughout the various steps of aggregation involved in producing the final input-output table. The reason for this is that individual commodities are not, in equal proportion, purchased by the different industries and final uses as output from a given industry.

## 2.4 Table and model

*What is an input-output model?*

An input-output table is an organized tabulation of detailed economic statistics described in the previous sections. An input-output model is a set of relations, conditions of equilibrium and identities, which are applied in connection with a vast volume of statistical data organized in formats corresponding to the structure of the input-output table. The results from the calculations describe a number of structural relations in the economy that are not easily observable, but which are - given the assumptions of the models - implicit in the input-output data in question.

*Distinction between table and model*

A sharp distinction is traditionally made between the input-output table and the input-output model, as the table is considered to be a purely statistical table containing observed data, while the transition to the model did not occur until specific relations (e.g. technical coefficients), which could be estimated on the basis of data, were assumed to have some form of invariability.

*Artificial distinction*

However, it appeared from the previous sections (and described in detail in Working paper no. 15) that there is no sharp distinction between table and model, as assumptions must already at a very early time in the process of constructing the table be adopted, with respect to, e.g. the technical relations related to production and market shares in order to construct an industry x industry table, due to the circumstance that the primary statistical data are not available in this form. To this is added that certain assumptions are required in distinguishing an import matrix, as there are usually no available statistical data on the commodity distribution of Danish production and imports by final uses. Finally, a deflation system with many inherent assumptions is a precondition of converting the table to constant prices.

*Multipliers constitute a further processing of data*

Against this background, the multipliers appearing in the following chapters can be regarded as a natural continuation of the work involved in constructing the input-output tables, as the assumptions adopted to form the basis for the calculations do not differ essentially from the assumptions made in connection with constructing the tables. Consequently, the multipliers can be regarded as highly processed statistical data rather than model calculations of the type known from macro-econometric models. In other words, the multipliers are intended to provide the information inherent in the input-output tables and associated data systems in a form, which for most users will be more easily accessible and of greater relevance than that of the basic input-output data.

*Inverted matrix*

Elements in what is known as the “inverted matrix” constitute the most simple form of multipliers, which were, including a matrix of “technical coefficients”, originally published together with the input-output tables. This was thus true of the input-

output tables for 1953 (Statistical Surveys no. 7, 1962) and for the input-output table for 1966 (Statistical Surveys nos. 30 and 31, 1973).

*Technical coefficients*

The technical coefficients are arrived at by dividing elements in each individual column in table types, such as tables 2.1 or 2.3., by the sum in the columns. Consequently, the sum of the coefficients in each column will therefore be a single one. Assuming that these coefficients do not depend on the level of production or final uses, an input-output model is thus created.

*From final use  
to total production*

Let us assume that an industry is to supply DKK 1 mio. more to, e.g. private consumption, the column of technical coefficients of the industry in question shows the supplies of raw materials that are required by each industry. In order to supply these raw materials, production must be similarly increased in the industries in question, and thereby there are requirements of further raw material supplies in accordance with the technical coefficients of these industries. This is, in principle, an infinite process, but for each round the effects derived are steadily reduced, and there is a threshold for the process implying that the increase in the production by each industry can be estimated as a consequence of the original increase in the private consumption of DKK 1 mio. The result from this calculation makes up the column of the industry in question in the “inverted matrix”. Consequently, this matrix is a table on the production multipliers.

*Technical coefficients or  
inverted matrices  
are not published*

Tables showing technical coefficients or inverted matrices are excluded from this publication. Our experience with previous publications (cf. the two publications mentioned above) show that tables of this type are not particularly user-friendly, as they do not provide an answer to the questions usually asked. This implies that further calculations are required and thereby insight into the method of input-output calculations as well as access to the necessary data. The multipliers in this publication are naturally based on the technical coefficients and inverted matrices, but in order to use the multipliers no input-output technical insight is needed by our users.

*Technical coefficients are  
assumed to be  
independant of the  
production level*

It was mentioned above that the only assumption of the input-output model is that the technical coefficients are independant of the level of production and final uses. This is an adequate assumption if the structural conditions of the economy are only analysed over the year for which the input-output table is constructed. An analysis of this type could be conducted by means of a survey of, e.g. how many persons are employed in each industry as a direct result of exports. In the following chapters, all multipliers (except for the multipliers projected for 2007) of this type, i.e. the multipliers of each year in the time series are estimated by applying technical coeffiecents for the year in question.

*Constancy of the technical  
coefficients is not essential  
over time*

However, the question about qualities of the technical coefficients when input-output analyses are conducted, will frequently also relate to their constancy over time, as coefficients estimated on the basis of input-output tables at constant price are usually considered. However, constancy of the technical coefficients is not a fundamental assumption of input-output calculations. On the contrary, a time series of input-output tables enables users to follow changes in input structures over time as well as the derived changes in multipliers. This implies that the time series of multipliers can provide a historical structure description and can be used in assessing whether a projection of data for years that are not covered by statistics is reasonable. Thus, the calculations for 2007 are based on the physical structure in 2005, except for the labour productivities obtained from the provisional national accounts for 2007.

*Slow mobility  
is an advantage*

Although, as a main rule, there is no need to make assumptions with respect to the development in the technical coefficients over time in order to calculate multipliers, it is essential with respect to the general usefulness of the input-output analysis that it can, at least, be assumed that the mobility of the technical coefficients of each industry is slow. As an input-output table cannot be completed until a couple of years after the year to which it refers, it is, however, essential that the results from the analysis can be considered valid also in addition to the period covered by the time

series of input-out tables. For some specific types of coefficients, e.g. those relating to labour productivities, attempts will be made to conduct separate projections of data.

*Mobility  
must be assessed*

Time series of multipliers show that mobility of the structures analysed is usually slow. Nevertheless, when multipliers are used for forecasts – and especially in the case of multipliers for a single industry or a single sub-group of final use – it must in each single case be assessed whether there are special conditions of importance. As far as the endogeneous version is concerned, changes in import shares can typically have an impact, and with respect to the exogeneous version, substitution of materials caused by technical progress and/or changes in relative prices can have an impact.

## 2.5 Investment matrices

*Sub-division of gross  
fixed capital formation*

While the columns in table 2.4 constitute a further specification of the column for private consumption in the 3 previous tables, specified investment columns of this type in accordance with ESA95 have not been available until recently. Investment values of the product balances have been sub-divided to capital formation by industry, covering for the time being the period 1993-2005. Only gross fixed capital formation is subdivided, implying that subdivided data on the investment type, Net acquisitions of valuables, is not available.

*What types of capital  
formation are distributed  
by investing industries?*

Subsequently, an investment matrix can be created in accordance with the same methods used in constructing the input-output table. The matrix thus provides a picture of the flows of investment goods from supplying to receiving industry. The matrix thus constitutes a disaggregation of the columns for gross fixed capital formation from the input-output table. The types of investment that are divided to several industries by capital formation comprise investment in Machines and equipment, in Transport equipment, in Industrial buildings, in Construction and in Software, as the other types of gross fixed capital formation are only separately compiled for a single industry.

*The tables shown with 26  
supplying industries*

An aggregated version of the investment matrix 2005 is shown in table 2.5. The table corresponds to table 2.1 on the supply side and contains 3 of the investment types, each with 9 investing industries in the columns. The 9 investing industries correspond to the 8-grouping in the present publication. However, 7009 Letting and sale of real estate is distinguished from the main group Finance and business activities due to its impact on investments in buildings. In this table, all imports are shown in a single row. In table 2.6 imports are divided in the same way as in table 2.2. The sum table of 2.5 (excl. the import row) and 2.6 is shown as table 2.7, corresponding closely to the structure in table 2.3. The 3 tables also contain for each type of investment a column showing total figures, and are also supplied with a section on total gross fixed capital formation.

*Detailed tables are  
preferable for analytical  
purposes*

Similar to tables 2.5 – 2.7, the primary purpose of tables showing highly aggregated data is to draw attention to the existence and structure of the tables. Usually the detailed tables will be preferred for analytical purposes, which on the supply side, consist of 130 industries, and capital formation is compiled for 56 investing industries, corresponding to the 52-standard grouping, except 73000 Research and development, 80000 Education and 92000 Recreational, cultural, sporting activities where market and non-market activity are subdivided, and 85109 Health activities is subdivided, so that it corresponds to the 130-grouping. For all these references to industry groups, please see appendix 1 where a description is given.

*Documentation*

Investment matrices analysed by products are briefly documented in Danish in the publication *Nationalregnskab 2007* (National Accounts 2007).

### 3. NAMEA – environmental/economic accounts

#### 3.1 Introduction

*Economic activity, natural resources and the environment*

Table 3.1 contains information on the relationship between economic activity on the one hand, and natural resources and the environment on the other hand. This information is aggregated in environmental/economic accounts following the so-called NAMEA principle. NAMEA is an abbreviation for National Accounting Matrix including Environmental Accounts. An increasing number of countries are gradually applying this principle in constructing cohesive and compact information on the economy, consumption of natural resources and pollution.

*Classifications and definitions*

The Danish environmental accounts are constructed as satellite accounts based on the input-output table. This implies that all data in the environmental accounts on energy and the environment are generally based on the definitions and classifications used in the national accounts. Consequently, data on the environment and resources are strictly comparable with the national accounts and the input-output table. It is also possible to conduct on the basis of an input-output model detailed analyses of the relationships between the economy and the environment.

*The problems of weighing up the different factors against each other*

While, e.g. gross value added can be considered as one (of several) performance target for economic activity, it is not possible to set up a corresponding performance target for economic activity and the environment as a whole. If an overall target were to be set up it would have to be based on the assumption that all conditions relating to the environment and natural resources could be weighed up against, partly each other and partly against the economic targets. For example, it would be necessary to weigh up the emission of CO<sub>2</sub> against the emission of NO<sub>x</sub>, energy consumption by industries and the gross domestic product. There is no generally accepted method of weighing up the different factors against each other, and it is unclear how the results from the method are to be interpreted, if it were possible in one way or another.

*Content*

The environmental/economic accounts for Denmark, which are shown here, contain 4 main groups of information:

- Economic activity
- Energy consumption and reserves of natural gas and oil in the North Sea
- Air emissions of the substances CO<sub>2</sub> (carbon dioxide), SO<sub>2</sub> (sulphur dioxide), NO<sub>x</sub> (nitrous oxide), CO (carbon monoxide), NH<sub>3</sub> (ammonia), N<sub>2</sub>O (laughing gas), CH<sub>4</sub> (methane), NMVOC (volatile organic compounds)
- The impact on the greenhouse effect and acidification caused by pollutants

*More accounts available at Statbank Denmark*

The accounts shown here include only some of the resource and environmentally related data in Statistics Denmark's environmental/economic accounts. In the series Statistical News, Environment and Energy, Environmental/Economic Accounts for Denmark (in Danish only), the accounts are extended by including statistics on water consumption, value of oil and natural gas reserves as well as environmental taxes and subsidies. These accounts can also be seen at Statbank Denmark.

*Future development of the accounts*

With the increasing volume of environmental data that are gradually available in a form enabling data to be linked with the classifications and definitions of the national accounts, the environmental/economic accounts and the associated analyses can be extended by also including these environmental data.

*Delimitation*

As the classifications and definitions in the environmental/economic accounts originate from the national accounts, the figures in the environmental accounts differ in some cases from corresponding figures in other contexts relating to environmental

statistics. For example, there are differences in the figures for CO<sub>2</sub> emissions appearing in the environmental/economic accounts and the figures for CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, which are reported in the context of the international climate convention to reduce greenhouse gases. The former reflects the emission related to Danish economic activities, regardless of where they take place. The latter reflects, to a greater extent, the emission taking place from the Danish geographic area, regardless of whether the emission is caused by Danish or foreign economic activities (see also section 8.2.).

- 2005* The environmental/economic accounts aggregated in table 3.1 relate to the year 2005, as this is the most recent year for which the input-output table is available. However, it appears from chapters 7 and 8 that some data are also available for subsequent years.

*Classifications* The accounts are available at a far greater level of detail than the one shown in the table. The detailed statistics thus provide data for 130 industries. In table 3.1 the industries are aggregated into 8 main groups (the industrial classifications appear in appendix 1). Similarly, the 40 types of energy covered by the accounts are aggregated into 4 types of energy in the table. Furthermore, different accounts on energy consumption (e.g. expenditure, associated taxes, weight, volume, calorific value, gross energy consumption) are in the table restricted to show the actual energy consumption estimated at Peta Joule (PJ). Chapters 7 and 8 contain a range of the detailed data.

*Horizontal and vertical* As with the input-output tables in chapter 2, it is characteristic of the NAMEA table that it can be read vertically (by following a column from top to bottom) as well as horizontally (by following a row from left to right). Reading the table in two ways, it is thus possible to analyse different aspects of an area. For example, information on how output of an industry is produced can be extracted by reading the table vertically, and how the same output is used and what emissions are created by reading the table horizontally. Furthermore, information on e.g. natural gas reserves in the North Sea is obtainable by reading the table vertically and information on natural gas consumption by reading the table horizontally.

*Different units* Economic information is estimated at DKK million, and energy information is given in Peta Joule (1 PJ = 10<sup>15</sup> Joules). The emission of pollutants is estimated at 1,000 tonnes. The impact on the greenhouse effect is expressed as Global Warming Potential, GWP, while the impact on acidification is expressed as Potential Acidification Equivalents, PAE.

### 3.2 Economic activity

The economic factors are summed up in the accounts by means of the input-output table with endogenous imports. The figures given here are, compared to the presentation of the input-output table in chapter 2 (table 2), further aggregated.

*Supply ...* As stated in chapter 2, a column for an industry (1.1-1.8) shows how the total production value of the industry is derived as the value of the products used in the production process to which taxes on products, VAT, etc. (net), compensation of employees, gross operating surplus (GOS) and mixed income are added. For each of the 4 groups of final use (i.e. private consumption expenditure, government consumption expenditure, capital formation and exports, columns 2.1.-2.4) the column in question shows how total value is derived from the value of Danish products supplied by 8 industry groups, the value of imported products and taxes on products paid and VAT, etc. (net).

<i>... and use ...</i>	A row for an industry (1.1-1.8) shows how the use of the production by the industry in question is distributed to, partly intermediate consumption of the 8 industries, partly the final use of private consumption expenditure, government consumption expenditure, capital formation and exports. The row for imports (I) in the input-output table shows how total imports to Denmark are used by each industry and for final use. Similarly, the rows II.1 and II.2 show how taxes on products (excl. customs duties) and VAT, etc. (net), respectively, compensation of employees, gross operating surplus and mixed income, are distributed to the industries and categories of final use that have paid for the expenditure.
<i>... are matched</i>	For each of the 8 industry groups, the total sum of the row is identical to the total sum of the column and equal to the production value. This also reflects that the production value is similar, whether it is calculated by adding up the various items of expenditure associated with production (sum of the column in row 3) or whether the value of what has been supplied by the industry for consumption in the various industries, is added to what has been supplied for final use (sum of the row in column 3).

### 3.3 Energy consumption

<i>Industries and households</i>	The energy flows are described in rows E.1-E.5 and E. For each group of energy the row in question shows the supply of energy (estimated at PJ), which is used as intermediate consumption by the industry groups, the supply of energy used by households for private consumption, the supply that was exported and the supply for other final uses (changes in stocks, etc.). The sums of the row in column 3 indicate the total consumption of energy. The figures on energy contain energy produced in Denmark as well as energy imported from other countries.

<i>Actual energy consumption</i>	Energy consumption, which is presented in the table, is calculated as actual quantities of energy, i.e. converted energy (e.g. electricity) as well as primary energy quantities (e.g. coal) used in producing the converted energy are included in the E-rows in the table.

<i>Danish ships abroad</i>	Large quantities of oil are tanked up by Danish ships and planes (bunkering) in foreign ports. This energy consumption is excluded from rows E.1-E.5 and E, but is included in row E.7.

<i>More information in chapter 7</i>	Chapter 7 contains information on actual energy consumption and on gross energy consumption at a more detailed level. The chapter also shows the results from the input-output model calculations, which focus on, e.g. the relationship between final uses and total energy consumption.

### 3.4 Reserves of oil and natural gas

<i>Stock-taking</i>	Columns E.1 and E.2 provide information on Danish reserves of natural gas and oil in the North Sea (expressed in PJ). Row R.1 starts off by giving data on opening stocks of natural gas and oil reserves. Imports are included in row I. Total Danish consumption (including consumption of imported energy) is deducted in rows E.1 and E.2, while row E.5 includes other quantity changes (adjustments of the estimate of oil and natural gas reserves). Further corrections of stocks are conducted in row 6, to take, e.g. flaring into account (surplus gas at offshore drilling platforms). When opening stocks are adjusted for imports, consumption, other quantity changes and corrections, closing stocks appear in row R.2.

<i>Relationship with energy consumption</i>	The use of natural gas and crude oil in the statistics on reserves in the E-columns in the accounts corresponds to the total input of the two energy types in industries and final uses, as described in the statistics on energy flows in column section 1-3, rows E.1 and E.2. Consequently, the consumption of natural gas and oil stated in column 3 corresponds to the items in the E-columns, but with the signs reversed, as figures in
---	--

column 3 represent an input, while figures in the E-columns represent a deduction from the opening stocks.

To illustrate developments in Danish reserves the difference between closing and openings stocks is shown explicitly in R.3, column section E.

*Definition of natural gas and oil reserves*

Opening and closing stocks in rows R.1 and R.2 relate to *reserves* of natural gas and oil, and not total geological deposits of the resources. The reserves are defined from the available quantity of the resource, which can technically and economically be extracted.

*Other quantity changes*

The statistics on quantity changes in row E.5 are compiled in accordance with the definition of reserves, as new methods and changes in energy prices have an effect on the scope of the energy quantities, which can technically and economically be extracted. Other quantity changes also appear in connection with new discoveries of natural gas or oil.

### 3.5 Air emissions

*Types of emission*

Emissions to the air of the substances CO<sub>2</sub>, SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub>, CO, NH<sub>3</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O, CH<sub>4</sub> and NMVOC (estimated at 1,000 tonnes) are covered by the environmental accounts. Information on origin of the pollutants is derived by following columns U.1-U.8 (column section U) from top to bottom.

*Origin of the emission*

Information on emissions by the industries is given in column section U, row section 1. Emissions of the 8 substances are given for each industry. Emissions by households are shown in column section U, row 2.1. Cross-border foreign airborne flows of SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>3</sub> and NH<sub>3</sub> into Denmark are shown in column section U, row I.

*Supply ...*

When emissions by industries and households are added to the cross-border flows into Denmark, information on total supply of pollutants to Denmark is obtained. This information is shown in column section U, row U.

*... and "use" ...*

Information on the “destination” of the substances on the “use” side is obtained by following rows U.1-U.8 from left to right. Cross-border flows of SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub> and NH<sub>3</sub> emanating from Denmark are listed in column section U, column 2.4, while the remaining quantities (total supply less cross-border flows emanating from Denmark) given in column section T are distributed to the environmental problems (environmental themes), which are affected by the pollutants in question. Emissions of CO<sub>2</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O and CH<sub>4</sub> are attributed to the greenhouse effect (column T.1), while SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub> and NH<sub>3</sub> are attributed to acidification (column T.2).

*... are matched*

The totals in the rows for cross-border flows emanating from Denmark and the distribution by environmental themes are listed in column U. It can be seen that total supply of pollutants (row U) is equal to total “use” (column U) of the pollutants.

The quantities, which are distributed to environmental themes for the above-mentioned 8 substances, are also shown in row U.A, column section U.

*Non-identifiable emissions*

For some man-made emissions it was impossible or it was considered inexpedient to distribute emissions to individual industries or households, due to either lack of knowledge or lack of information on the nature of the emissions. Information on non-identifiable emissions is included in U-rows at the bottom of the table.

Row U.a gives information on emissions from using the quantities of oil tanked up (bunkers) by Danish ships and planes in foreign ports.

Emissions from distribution of fossil energy in row U.b, relate to emissions from the storage of coal.

Solvents are used by most industries and households. There is a large group of different solvents, and there is no systematic information on the distribution of solvents to industries and households. Furthermore, some emissions from industrial processes cannot on the basis of statistical data be distributed to industries. Consequently, they are generally included in row U.c.

*Growth in biomass  
and nature*

CO<sub>2</sub> emissions related to the incineration of renewables (included in row sections 1, 2 and U, column section U) correspond to a similar quantity of CO<sub>2</sub>, which is absorbed during the growth of renewable energy. This quantity of CO<sub>2</sub> is indicated with a negative sign in row U.d. Total CO<sub>2</sub> emissions are thus reduced by the share from renewable energy when the total impact on the greenhouse effect (see below) is estimated. In row U.e the negative impact from CO<sub>2</sub> is associated with the linkage of CO<sub>2</sub> in connection with the net growth in biomass.

*Further information in  
chapter 8*

Chapter 8 provides both more detailed information on emissions of CO<sub>2</sub>, SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub> and the results from input-output model calculations, focusing on, e.g. the relationship between final uses and total emissions. Chapter 8 also describes the data sources and methods used in compiling the statistics on emissions.

### 3.6 Greenhouse effect and acidification

*Different chemical  
substances are weighed up  
against each other*

In the U rows at the bottom of column section T, the different air emissions are recalculated to reflect the potential harmful impact in connection with the greenhouse effect and acidification. Emissions have been recalculated on the basis of weights transforming tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O, and CH<sub>4</sub> into what is called Global Warming Potentials (GWP) and tonnes of SO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>x</sub> og NH<sub>3</sub> into what is called Potential Acid Equivalents (PAE).

Only figures that are not given in parentheses are included in the recalculations of figures into GWP or PAE. For example, information on acidification caused by the emissions of SO<sub>2</sub> and NO<sub>x</sub> taking place when Danish ships and planes are tanked up in foreign ports (bunkering), is excluded from the calculations. The reason is that the theme on acidification in the environmental accounts concerns acidification in Denmark, and that emissions of SO<sub>2</sub> and NO<sub>x</sub> caused by Danish ships abroad are assumed to have no effect on acidification in Denmark.

It should be noted that substances other than CO<sub>2</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O, and CH<sub>4</sub> are assumed to influence the greenhouse effect. However, the substances included here are the most important ones.

## 4. Introductory table explanations

### 4.1 Multiplier concept

*What are the uses of the input-output model?*

On the basis of the input-output model, the effects from changes in external factors (exogenous variables) on the factors determined by the model (endogenous variables) can be estimated. Typical examples of exogenous variables are private consumption, capital formation and exports, while the endogenous variables in the input-output model will be imports, employment, energy consumption and emissions of pollutants.

*Multiplier concept*

The result obtained for the endogenous variable, when the exogenous variable is changed by means of a unit, is called a multiplier. This designation is attributed to the effects on an endogenous variable resulting from an arbitrary change in an exogenous variable, which is achieved by multiplying the exogenous change by the multiplier in question.

*Production multipliers*

All estimated multipliers are partial in that they only embrace the type of derived effects resulting from the mutual supplies of raw materials among industries. Subsequently, they can also be described as production multipliers unlike the type of more complete multipliers appearing when, e.g. private consumption and capital formation are endogenously determined by the model. The Keynesian multiplier is of the latter type, and the standard example is here income multipliers exceeding 1, as an exogenous increase in the final demand of DKK 1 mio. will give rise to an increase in the domestic product of over DKK 1 mio., due to the circumstance that the income generated in the first instance of the increase in demand will, to some extent, be used for private consumption, which in turn results in increasing incomes, etc. It appears from tables 5.C.3 and 5.C.4 in chapter 5 that "income multiplication" of the input-output multipliers is always under 1 (and can theoretically not exceed 1). In contrast, the input-output multipliers in relation to the production value will, as a general rule, exceed 1. For example, an increase in the consumption demand by an unit implies that the production values in the economy are increased by more than a unit, as the industries directly producing the unit make demands on raw material supplies from other industries, etc., cf. section 2.4 in chapter 2.

*Multipliers hinge on the model selected*

As is the case with other economic factors estimated on the basis of a model, the interpretation of all input-output multipliers must therefore make allowance for the design of the model. Some of these conditions are outlined in chapter 2, and here it will only be mentioned that the strength of the input-output model is inherent in its simple structure enabling calculations of highly detailed multipliers, which are easily interpreted. On the other hand, attention must be drawn to the fact that all present multipliers are estimated by means of "open" input-output models, i.e. only within the circular flow of raw materials does the derived effects play a role. Subsequently, there are no effects that can be attributed to, e.g. the fact that changes in income may be used for private consumption or that changes in the production could lead to an increase in capital formation. It is however possible on the basis of the existing primary statistical data to construct more "closed" input-output models, which include further derived effects of this type (and thereby generally increase the multipliers), but the assumptions required by extending the model will invariably involve many problems, compared to the assumptions inherent in the open model.

*Endogenous and exogenous model*

Chapter 2 describes two different methods of constructing the input-output table. In the first version, all imports are entered as primary input, while in the second version imports by industry are most frequently entered as negative final demand. The corresponding types of input-output models are called, respectively the endogenous and the exogenous version, as imports can be estimated in the first version, but not in the second version.

*Interpretation of the exogenous model*

While it is intuitively easy to understand the function of the endogenous model-version, a further interpretation of multipliers estimated on the basis of the exogenous model-version is needed, as they are actually estimated on the assumption that import shares are equal to zero. The multipliers can, in principle, be interpreted in two different ways. Firstly, they can be interpreted as the *maximum effects* that are possible to achieve in the change of the domestic demand in question, i.e. if all marginal import shares were equal to zero. Secondly, they can be regarded as the *global effects* of the changes in demand in question, provided that the production methods abroad were assumed to be similar to the domestic methods.

However, it must be emphasized that the assumptions of similar conditions of production in Denmark and abroad do not only hinge on the business structure and production technology in a narrow sense. Energy intensities, energy types used and emission coefficients for the energy types are also assumed to be the same in Denmark and abroad. These assumptions cannot be maintained if the imported goods are, e.g. produced in Sweden by businesses using energy generated by water power. In this case, the energy-related emission in Sweden is equal to zero, but the input-output calculation will give rise to emissions corresponding to the emissions that would have occurred, if the imported goods were instead produced in Denmark using electricity from Danish power plants.

In the present publication, the exogenous version is mainly used for calculating energy content and emissions, and the designation "global" is used for these multipliers in the tables, as this interpretation is, cf. the explanatory description of each table in the present and subsequent chapters, the most obvious one. When the results from the calculations of the endogenous model-version are given in the tables next to the "global" effects, they relate to the effects "in Denmark".

*Quantity model and possible interpretations*

All multipliers are, in principle, quantity multipliers, as they are estimated by means of models, which are assumed to reflect the physical production structures, and the results take the form of changes in a quantity (estimated in terms of DKK mio., number of persons, tons of emissions or Terajoules) caused by changes in another quantity (estimated in terms of DKK mio.). However, as a result of the simple structure of the input-output model, it is possible to interpret many multipliers in alternative ways as if they were obtained as results from calculations based on a price model (the dual model for the quantity model).

*Interpreted as a price model*

If it is assumed that the physical input structure does not react to changes in the relative prices, and that all price increases are completely passed on, the percentage content of a primary input in a unit for a given final use will also indicate the size of the percentage change in the price for final use that can be expected, if there are changes in the price for a primary input. Prices for the primary inputs in the dual model are thus the exogenous variables, while prices for the final uses are the endogenous variables. Assuming that the direct and indirect import content in a consumer group is 20 pct., prices in the consumer group would increase by 20 pct. if import prices were doubled (subsequently, the import content at current prices would make up 33 pct., i.e. 40 out of 120).

## 4.2 Data and calculations for 2005 and 2007

<i>Primary statistical data</i>	The primary statistical data for input-output and emission multipliers consist of:
1.	Input-output table for 2005 at current prices
2.	Employment in terms of the number of persons employed by industry and 2 job categories in 2005
3.	Energy consumption by industry and final uses in terms of quantities (TJ) and values in 2005
4.	Air emissions in tons by industries and households
5.	Price indices for production values of industries and for final uses in 2007, base year 2005 = 100
6.	Price indices for about 185 groups of imported goods for 2007, 2005 = 100
7.	Labour productivities in 2007, similar to 5. above, based on the national accounts (November version) for 2002-2007, which is preliminary from 2006
<i>Level of detail</i>	The first 4 types of data are available at the most detailed groupings in the national accounts, comprising 130 industries and 14 major groups of final use, of which private consumption is subdivided into 73 groups and exports into 11 groups (corresponding to the 10 SITC major groups and a group for exports of services). Data types 5 and 7 are based on an aggregated industry classification by 26 industries.
<i>Detailed calculations are traditional input-output analyses</i>	Calculations at the most detailed level for 2005 are conducted as traditional input-output analyses, whereby the direct and indirect contents of a primary input in a final use or the direct and indirect emissions associated with a final use are determined. The final use comprises, depending on the table types, either DKK 1 mio. final demand for the production of an industry at basic prices or for a demand category (private consumption expenditure, general government final consumption expenditure etc.) at purchaser's prices. Technically, the calculations are conducted by using what is known as the endogenous version of the input-output model, with the exception of the calculations of global effects, where the exogenous model is applied, see section 4.1.
<i>Direct content</i>	It may be useful to make the meaning of <i>direct and indirect content</i> clear in order to understand the character of these calculations. The direct content in a use category (it may be the total input use by an industry or a final demand at purchaser's prices) consists of the value or the physical quantity included in the use, most frequently calculated per unit used. Some types of direct content, e.g. imports and employment, are characterized by being included in each individual use, without having been subjected to any domestic processing, and these types are called primary factors or inputs. In principle, it is also possible to observe statistically the direct content. In the special calculations of energy and emissions, energy and emissions are treated as primary inputs.
<i>Indirect content</i>	The indirect contents are obtained by calculating the content of primary input or air emissions associated with supplies from domestic industries. As the supplies from other industries, in turn, require supplies from other industries and thereby direct and indirect imports, employment, energy and air emissions, it is obvious that the calculations will ultimately involve all mutual relations among the industries (and among the industries and the final use categories). Calculating each individual multiplier implies that all information on the production structure in society is involved, and the possibility of taking the comprehensive interaction into account is exactly the essence of an input-output calculation.
<i>Detailed calculations and aggregated results</i>	In calculating the aggregated industry tables for 2005, the calculations were first undertaken at the most detailed level, comprising 130 industries, and subsequently the results were weighed up for the 52, 26 or 8 industry groups included in the standard aggregations of the national accounts. In the tables showing direct

requirements, the production values of the individual industries included are applied as weights in the industry group. As mentioned above, the tables dealing with direct and indirect requirements show the content of a primary input or air emissions per DKK mio. final demand in accordance with an industry's production at basic prices, and against this background weights derived from the values at basic prices for supplies to final demand in the appropriate model of the individual industries to be aggregated, are applied in weighing up the data. Thereby, consistency between the results for the detailed industries and industry groups is achieved. This would not have been the case, if the calculations had been undertaken by means of an input-output model, which had already been aggregated to e.g. the 26 industry groups.

*Maximum level of detail in the projected tables*

Calculation of the aggregated tables at the level of 2007 prices and by using the 2007 labour productivities is undertaken by applying in all stages of the calculation the most detailed information, see overview of data, items 5-7, and subsequently data are weighed up for the 26 and 8 industry groups. Except for labour productivities, it is assumed that the physical conditions of production remain unchanged from 2005.

*Special demand categories*

In order to understand the results, it may be useful to make specific comments to 3 of the main types of final use. They concern investments in livestock, increases in stocks and tourist revenues. From an isolated view, the multipliers for the first two types are only of limited interest. However, they are included in each table for the purpose of taking the general logical relation of the input-output calculations into account, as illustrated, e.g. in text tables 4.1 and 4.2 and in tables 5.F.1 and 6.F.1.

*Livestock*

*Livestock* comprises bovine cattle over 2 years, horses and sheep, sows and hogs. These livestock changes are regarded as part of fixed investments, while other changes in livestock are regarded as changes in stocks. Livestock changes are supplied by agriculture and by imports, and they are therefore "produced" in terms of input-output by means of the average input structure in agriculture. The reason why multipliers for livestock may deviate from the multipliers for agriculture is due to imports of certain animals covered by the group.

*Stock changes*

With respect to *stock changes* any stability in the coefficient column, showing which industries supply goods to inventories, cannot, in principle, be assumed. The sign of the various supplies may easily differ. The estimated multipliers may, of course, be arbitrarily positive or negative, and are not expected to show any stability over time.

*Income from tourism*

In the national accounts *tourist revenues* are deducted as a whole from household consumption and is added to exports, cf. table 2.1. To ensure realistic multipliers for this demand category, and thereby for exports and total private consumption, tourist revenues were, prior to undertaking the multiplier calculations, distributed to supplying industries and to primary factors. This distribution was performed on the basis of internal data material at Statistics Denmark based on a project conducted by Visit Denmark supplemented by the Institute of Local Government Studies (AKF) for establishing a tourism database.

*Financial intermediation services indirectly measured*

*Financial intermediation services indirectly measured (FISIM)* were previously estimated as the interest differential in financial intermediation. In the national accounts, this amount was as a whole deducted from total gross value added in order to be able to include the interest differential in the production value of Finance (industry 65000), and thereby refraining from undertaking an estimated industrial break down of the amount as intermediate consumption. For input-output analyses FISIM was seen as a separate group of final demand, only supplied by the industry Financial intermediation. This approach has now been changed, and based on the difference between an estimated reference rate and the actual interest rate for both loans and deposits calculations have been carried out showing an estimated payment of interest differential by industries and a few groups of final demand. The fact that FISIM may now be e.g. exported is a major change in the System of National Accounts, since payments of interest thus may be factor income, something previous

systems have always refrained from doing. The special group of final demand FISIM has consequently disappeared.

### 4.3 Examples of how multipliers are used

For the purpose of illustrating how multipliers may be used and the relationship with figures in absolute terms in the national accounts, three examples linking imports, employment and energy consumption and emissions together with final uses, are shown in the present section. In connection with the examples, explanations or definitions of the concepts involved are not given (e.g. employment and gross energy consumption). Instead, reference is made to the chapters dealing specifically with the subjects in question.

- 1st example* Table 4.1 shows the results from some summary calculations, where import and employment multipliers from, respectively columns 3 and 5 in table 4.A.2 are multiplied by the figures in absolute terms for the final demands in 2005, which are detailed in table 5.C.2. Thereby, total imports and total employment are distributed to the demand components that ultimately gave rise to imports or employment.

- 2nd example* Table 4.2 shows some summary results from the calculations based on energy multipliers for final uses in table 7.E.2, columns 4 (can be found again in table 4.A.2, column 7) and 5. When multipliers are multiplied by the absolute amounts for the 8 categories of final use, the total energy consumption is referred to the final uses that ultimately gave rise to it. The calculations are conducted partly for the global contents of energy, partly for energy conveyed to the products in Denmark. In the latter case, the total distributed energy use (including the content of exports) is summed up to the total gross energy consumption in Denmark, whereas in the former case, allowance is made for the estimated energy content of imports of non-energy goods. This energy content of imports is estimated by assuming that the technology applied in producing the energy corresponds to the one applied in similar domestic processes of production. Commodity types produced only abroad are referred to the Danish production structure deemed to be the most expedient one.

In the calculation of the total energy content in table 4.2, the quantity 754,000 TJ can be called the "adjusted gross energy consumption", reflecting the global energy requirements in connection with final domestic demand. However, this concept is of a technical character, while gross energy consumption as usually defined in the present context at 803,000 TJ, reflects the need for supplying energy products to Denmark. It appears that the difference between the two concepts amounts to 49,000 TJ, which is the additional content of energy in Danish exports (of non-energy goods) as compared to Danish imports (of non-energy goods).

*3rd example*

Table 4.3 shows the results from calculating the direct and indirect CO<sub>2</sub>-emissions linked to private consumption. The first column of the table shows the level of private consumption estimated at purchaser's prices and distributed to main consumer groups as it appears from table 5.C.2. The sum of total private consumption can also be found again in table 4.1. Multiplying the values of private consumption within the main consumer groups with the associated multipliers for the direct and indirect CO<sub>2</sub> emissions, the direct and indirect CO<sub>2</sub>-emissions are obtained. See also table 8.IV.1.

## 4.4 Summary tables

<i>Brief instructions</i>	A brief explanation of the content of each table as well as guidance on how to read the figures are given below. Figures in parentheses refer to column numbers in the table in question. Self-explanatory columns are not mentioned. In text section 4.2 a description is given of what is implied by direct and indirect content.
<i>Summary tables</i>	<i>The multiplier summary tables</i> show partly the direct and partly the direct plus the indirect content of imports, employment and energy for 2005 and for 2007 – where year 2007 - as mentioned at the beginning – is estimated on the basis of the production structure in 2005, but using the actual prices and labour productivities for 2007.  The summary tables can function in three ways as an introduction to understanding the multipliers and the other tables in chapters 5-7.
<i>Difference between direct and indirect content</i>	Firstly, the direct and the direct plus the indirect effects are shown next to each other in the tables, thus providing an immediate overview of the size of the indirect effects, and thereby the impact of including the entire economic structure as described by the input-output tables, in the calculations .

Subsequently, the multiplier contains both the energy quantity used in Denmark and abroad (via the energy directly and indirectly used in producing the imported goods, which are directly or indirectly used for the production in question), see the description of the exogenous model in section 4.1.

The multiplier can thus reflect the total energy consumption caused by an unit of the production in question (i.e. the quantity that can be purchased for DKK 1 mio.). The multiplier is thus characterized as a “technical” one, indicating the total energy intensity.

## 5. Production and final use

### 5.1 Contributions to growth

The fact that Gross Domestic Product at market price equals the sum of the final demands at purchasers value, from which imports valued c.i.f. have been subtracted, has traditionally been used to split the domestic growth by groups of final demand. This is now done at chained values and the yearly percentage changes are shown in Table 5.1.

It is seen in the table that over 40% of the total 3.53% growth from 1999 to 2000 is attributed to investment, and that net export only contributes 15% since imports seriously reduces the export figure.

Another way to split the domestic growth by groups of final demand could be, using an input-output model, to calculate the sum of the components of GDP that are directly and indirectly caused by the different components of final demand. The result of this type of calculation is shown in table 5.2.<sup>1</sup>

It may well be argued that this method, that only attributes 14% of the 1999 to 2000 growth to investment, gives a more meaningful split, since it attributes to each component of final demand our best estimate of the amount of GDP it has generated.

### 5.2 Overview of the rest of the chapter

#### *Actual figures for 2005*

Table 5.3 in this chapter shows production value, gross value added, compensation of employees and employment by industry 2005. The level of final uses at purchaser's prices is shown in the first column of multiplier table 5.C.2, as there was a blank space there.

#### *Multipliers for 2005*

Apart from this, the chapter primarily contains completely traditional input-output analyses, partly detailed for 2005 and partly more aggregated as time series concerning the import contents of the uses over the period 1975-2005. Table 5.F.1 is slightly less traditional showing the dependency of each industry on the various types of final use, when it is taken into account that in order to satisfy the demand, inputs

are normally required by other industries. For example, it can be seen in table 2.1 that only about 15 pct. of production in the agricultural sector is exported, but taking the above-mentioned effects into account, about 75 pct. of production in agriculture can be attributed to exports.

### 5.3 Table contents

*Type C,  
classic input-output  
calculations*

These tables containing data on economic aggregates constitute a consistent calculation of respectively, direct and direct plus indirect contents of input. In the latter type of calculation, input of domestically manufactured raw materials is converted into its content of primary input (imports, indirect taxes, net, compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income). This constitutes a classic input-output calculation, and it should be noted that row sums are equal to 100, corresponding to a unit of final use which always directly and indirectly requires a unit of primary input.

*Table 5.C.1* A row in the table shows the percentage distribution of the direct input for production at basic prices broken down by domestic supplies of raw materials, imports, indirect taxes, net, compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income. Subsequently, the row sums of columns 2-6 are equal to 100.

*Table 5.C.2* A row in the table shows the percentage distribution of the category in question comprising final demand at purchaser's prices. Compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income are not directly part of final use, and there are therefore no columns for these two items. The row sums of columns 3-5 are equal to 100. In this table, there is a blank space in column 1 for including the final uses at purchaser's prices. The SITC groups shown in the table are described in appendix 3.

*Table 5.C.3* A row for an industry shows how supplies of the industry for final use at basic prices are directly and indirectly composed of primary input. In relation to table 5.C.1, the column of domestic supplies of raw materials is, by means of the input-output calculations, split up into constituents of primary inputs, which are then added up to the direct primary input. Consequently, there is no column of domestic supplies in this table, but the row sums for columns 2-5 are still equal to 100.

*Table 5.C.4* A row for a category of final demand shows how the category at purchaser's prices is directly and indirectly composed of primary input. In relation to table 5.C.2, the direct domestic supplies are by means of input-output calculations split up into their constituents of primary inputs. Consequently, there is no column for domestic supplies in this table, but by virtue of the calculations, data are obtained for inclusion in the columns for imports and indirect taxes and for setting up columns for compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income. The row sums for columns 2-5 are equal to 100.

*Type F,  
distribution table*

In this table type, cross-tabulations of a primary input in the industries and the final uses, which ultimately caused the consumption of the primary input in question, are undertaken. Table 6.F.1 shows this calculation for employment, but it can be generalised to concern the distribution of production value, and thus by an arbitrarily primary input by causing final demand category.

*Table 5.F.1* It is a direct consequence of the linear character of the input-output model that all primary inputs used by an industry are broken down in the same way by causing final demand category. Owing to the proportionality between the production value and use of primary inputs, the percentage distribution of production value by causing final demand in table 5.F.1 can also be used as key for distributing direct use of the industry, such as imports, energy, compensation of employees, gross operating surplus and mixed income and, of course, employment, cf. table 6.F.1 where the horizontal percentage distribution in the rows for the 130 industries is similar to the

one explicitly shown in table 5.F.1. Furthermore, chapter 8 shows in accordance with the same principle a cross-tabulation of air emissions by industries and the final uses ultimately causing these emissions.

*Type T,  
time series of import  
shares*

In this chapter, these tables show direct and direct and indirect import shares. All calculations are performed on the basis of data at *current prices*. For all tables of this type it is possible to compare the shares over time and among the industries for each year.

*Table 5.C.1* Shows the direct import shares of industries estimated as the percentage share of imports of the production value at basic prices.

*Table 5.T.2* Shows the direct import shares of final uses estimated as the percentage share of imports of the type of final demand at purchaser's prices in question.

*Table 5.T.3* Shows the direct and indirect import shares by industries. The figures thus reflect the percentage of final demand according to the production value at basic prices of an industry, which is ultimately imported – either by the industry itself or by the domestic industries directly and indirectly involved in supplying raw materials to the industry. These multipliers can also be regarded as a reflection of how sensitive an industry is to changes in import prices – and how its independency has changed over time.

*Table 5.T.4* Shows the direct and indirect import shares of final uses. The interpretation corresponds to the one provided for table 5.T.3 above, with the exception that shares are here estimated as percentages of final uses at purchaser's prices.

## 6. Employment

### 6.1 Statistics on employment in the national accounts

*Employment and hours of work performed*

The use of labour is estimated in connection with the national accounts. The statistics on employment, and as of December 2002 on hours of work performed, are broken down by industries and distributed by employees and self-employed.

*Working time accounts*

The statistics are now based on the working time accounts, where employment is estimated on the basis of Register-based Labour Force Statistics (RAS), and compensation of employees is estimated from the statistics on employment in businesses (EBS). When data sources are fully integrated, including statistics on wages, hours of work performed are compiled in the working time accounts. The inclusion of the working time accounts has resulted in a minor revision of employment figures. The revised figures on employment are estimated back to 1966.

*Adjusted to comply with the national accounts*

The working time accounts are partially adjusted to comply with the definitions in the national accounts. However, to compile statistics on labour and compensation of employees in the national accounts, it is necessary to undertake further adjustments of the working time accounts. For example, with respect to industries defined by their activity, which result in relocations of respectively, employment, hours of work and wage and salary costs among industries. For further description (in Danish), please see *Nationalregnskab 2007*, chapters 6.8 and 6.9. Although employment includes people temporarily on leave (cfr. ESA 11.14) they are excluded in this publication, since it can not be expected that an increase in the production of an industry also leads to more people on leave from the industry.

Please bear in mind that data on employment in 2005 by industry are given in table 5.3.

### 6.2 Current or constant prices

*Present conditions are described at current prices*

All multipliers for 2005 (and 2007) in chapters 4 and 5 are estimated on the basis of data at current prices of the year in question. The reason for this is to provide the most recently updated picture of the prevailing conditions – cf. in this context the projection of data until 2007 at current prices. Another advantage of the calculations at current prices is that users do not encounter further problems of interpretation with respect to multipliers estimated from data at constant prices. Subsequently, the multipliers in chapters 4 and 5 are strictly comparable with respect to the various effects, which is the primary aim when calculations are only shown for one single year.

*Time series are most frequently estimated at constant prices*

However, when time series of multipliers are calculated there are invariably conditions supporting the use of time series at constant prices. For example, when conducting analyses of trends in the consumption of physical aggregates, such as labour or energy per unit produced over time, this unit must also be regarded as a homogeneous physical quantity over time, i.e. it must be estimated at constant prices. However, this consideration cannot be generalized, implying that all time series should only be estimated on the basis of figures at constant prices. Subsequently, time series of multipliers which, as shown in chapter 5, indicate the percentage content of, e.g. imports, i.e. multipliers, where both exogenous and endogenous variables are estimated at DKK mio. and where data at current prices over time can also be interpreted in a manner that is of interest to users.

*Multipliers at constant prices are comparable over time*

A general feature of time series of multipliers estimated on the basis of figures at constant prices is that they can only be interpreted *over time* (horizontally), but cannot be compared between industries or final uses (vertically), apart from the base year for constant price-calculations, i.e. 2000. This is due to the circumstance

that the "physical unit" of, for example, production by industries is the quantity that can be purchased for DKK 1 mio. at the prices prevailing in precisely 2000 (a Leontief unit). Consequently the relative prices of the physical output of the industries in the base year define the relation between the industries, and had another base year been selected that relation could well have been quite different.

<i>Time series as indices</i>	Consequently the tables showing time series of employment requirements by different types of use at 2000-prices are in index form with the value for 2000 as index 100. The actual 2000 value is shown in the first column. In this form the time series may be compared over time and between industries and final uses.
<i>Multipliers at current prices are comparable between uses and may be comparable over time</i>	It can be generally said about time series of multipliers estimated on the basis of figures at current prices that they are comparable among industries and/or final uses (vertical), but they are at same time comparable over time (horizontal) in those cases, where they can also be interpreted as the result from calculations applying a price model, see section 4.1 of chapter 4. Subsequently, time series of multipliers for the content of imports or expenditure on energy, which are only estimated on the basis of figures at current prices, can be directly interpreted as a description of how prices for each industry or final use over time have been influenced by trends in prices for imports and energy.

*Table type F, Distribution table*

This table type is explained in section 5.2. As stated in this section, the distribution to final uses of employment is identical to the percentage distribution of production for the 130 basic industries shown in table 5.F.1.

- Distribution table 6.F.1*
- (2) Shows absolute employment in each industry, which is caused by private consumption. The total figure in the column shows the total number of persons employed, which is caused by private consumption.
  - (3) As column 2 for government consumption.
  - (4) As column 2 for capital formation in buildings and installations.
  - (5) As column 2 for other capital formation.
  - (6) As column 2 for exports of goods and services.
  - (7) As column 2 for capital formation in stocks This residual group is not of independent interest, but is included to ensure that the row sums of columns 2-7 (apart from errors due to rounding) add up to total employment by industries in column 1.

*Type T, time series of employment multipliers*

This table type shows the different measurements of the effects on employment caused by final uses and by industries. The employment figures included in the calculations are in each case compiled as the number of persons, irrespective of whether the persons work full-time or part-time. The calculations in tables 6.T.1.-6.T.5 are based on the input-output tables at 2000 prices. While the value in column 1 for 2000 is comparable between industries or final uses, that would not have been the case for

other years. Consequently the time series are shown as indices with 2000 = 100, thus making them comparable both over time and between industries or final uses.

- Table 6.T.1* Shows the direct employment requirements of industries per DKK mio. production value at basic prices in 2000. The time series, which is in index form with 2000 = 100, can also be interpreted as indications of reciprocal direct labour productivities.
- Table 6.T.2* Shows the direct and indirect employment requirements in Denmark per DKK mio. final demand of production value at basic prices of industries in 2000. The time series can also be interpreted as indicating reciprocal labour productivities in relation to the efficiency of the overall economic system in producing the goods and services that constitute the finished product of the industries in question – assuming the actual import shares of each year.
- Table 6.T.3* Shows the direct and indirect employment effects in Denmark per DKK mio. final demand at purchaser's prices in 2000. The time series can also be interpreted as indications of the reciprocal labour productivities in relation to the efficiency of the overall economic system in producing the goods and services included in the type of final demand in question – with the actual import shares of each year.
- Table 6.T.4* Shows the global employment effects in 2000 per DKK mio. final demand of production value at basic prices of industries. In this calculation, the import content of the goods is assumed to be produced on the basis of a technology corresponding to the one applied in the domestic industries, implying that the employment content of imports is also included. The advantage of this is that the time series of indices is not influenced by changes in the import shares over time. Consequently, these time series are the purest reflection of trends in the efficiency of the overall domestic economic system in producing the goods and services, which constitute the finished products of each industry.
- Table 6.T.5* Shows the global employment effects per DKK mio. final demand at purchaser's prices in 2000. The interpretation of the time series of indices of multipliers with 2000 = 100 corresponds to what is stated under table 6.T.4.

## 7. Energy accounts

### 7.1 Introduction

*Energy goods*

As outlined in chapter 2, about 2,350 balances of supply and use of goods and services are compiled to form the basis for the national accounts statistics. About 40 of the balances relate to energy goods. The information about these goods is gathered in what is known as energy matrices, showing the energy accounts.

*Background*

As early as during the first energy crisis in 1973 it became very quickly obvious that the establishment of energy matrices estimated in terms of value, physical units and calorific values with a detailed distribution of goods and classified in accordance with the groupings used for industries and final uses in the national accounts, was a prerequisite for being able to conduct serious analyses of the interaction between the economy and energy. The necessity of this is emphasized by the increasing attention focused on the environmental impact of economic activities. The present system, which is compiled in collaboration with the Danish Energy Authority, covers the period from 1975, but was constructed after the national accounts statistics were compiled in accordance with the definitions of the European System of Accounts (ESA 1995) and the later revision of data starting with detailed data for 1990, where it was not a priority to ensure consistency between national accounts data and energy data. Consequently the historic time series do not achieve complete consistency between the energy system and the national accounts, since additional information was available when the energy matrices were drawn up.

### 7.2 Calculation of gross energy

*Gross energy consumption*

Energy consumption by type of uses are calculated on the basis of estimated gross energy consumption to avoid duplicate countings. The conversion among actual energy consumption and gross energy consumption exemplified in table 7.1 implies firstly that oil products are estimated in terms of refined products ex refinery (or as imports, cif), and secondly that the converted energy types, electricity, district heating and town gas produced by gasworks are replaced by the calorific value of the fuel quantities included in their production. Losses in connection with conversion and distribution are thus distributed to customers of the converted energy. As it appears from the table, this approach implies that the direct energy consumption for conversion by electricity and district heating plants and gasworks is set at zero. The waste in connection with storage and transport of solid and liquid fuels is also distributed to customers of the energy types in question.

*Improved efficiency in the conversion can be seen among users*

Consequently, an increasing efficiency in the conversion or a decrease in the losses in distribution imply that for a constant consumption of converted energy among the final consumers, a smaller quantity of gross energy is used. This is particularly true of district heating, where considerable differences can be seen among trends in the two measurements. This is due to the fact that district heating is to a varying extent generated by partly combined heat and power plants and partly actual district heating plants, of which the first-mentioned plants are traditionally considered as the most efficient in terms of gross energy. The general increase in the share of district heating produced by combined plants over time has resulted in a slower increase in district heating estimated in terms of gross energy as compared to estimates in terms of specific units. The distinction of inputs in combined heat and power plants into parts for production of electricity and heat is conducted on the basis of a convention, resting more on a traditionally economic rather than a physical rationale.

*Net imports of electricity*

Import, net of electricity is converted to gross energy under the assumption that it is produced on the basis of the same technology as the one applied for electricity produced domestically. No external trade of the two remaining converted types of energy (district heating and gas produced by gasworks) is recorded.

### 7.3 Use of energy data

*Time of preparation*

The first version of energy matrices consisting of quantities and calorific values is compiled about 1 year after the end of the year for which the calculations are made. The first version of the value matrices is also drawn up at that time. The final verification with the national accounts, which rarely gives rise to substantial changes in the matrices, cannot be undertaken until the final national accounts are compiled some 3 years after the year under review.

*Data available for  
1975-2007*

At present, energy matrices of all types have been prepared for the years 1975-2007, and are considered to be final up to and including 2005. Owing to the extent of the matrices, they are not published in their entirety, but are entered into a databank in various formats. This bank is available from [www.dst.dk/inputoutput](http://www.dst.dk/inputoutput).

*Used together with  
input-output tables*

The direct connection to the national accounts makes it possible to use the energy accounts together with the input-output tables in the same way as data on employment was used in Chapter 6, cfr. the multiplier calculations in this chapter.

In the following tables, energy consumption is not distributed by energy types, but is only shown as a total figure for each use. Quantities are estimated in terms of gross energy consumption, whereas the values in table 7.3 relate to the actual expenditure for energy at current prices, including taxes on products, net. To make allowance for the relationship between quantities and values, the value of fuel for conversion by electricity and district heating plants and gasworks is set at zero. It should be noted that the value level in the multiplier tables is, unlike in Table 7.3, given at basic prices (i.e. ex factory price, exclusive of trade margins and taxes on products). It appears from table 7.2 that total gross energy consumption by industries in 2005 accounted for 495 956 TJ, whereas direct gross energy consumption by households accounted for 307 135 TJ.

Unlike the multipliers in column 4, this multiplier is restricted to contain the energy quantities, which must be directly and indirectly supplied in Denmark. The multiplier can be considered to reflect the volume of energy that must be supplied in Denmark per DKK mio. final use of production at basic price from the industry in question.

- (6) Shows the direct and indirect expenditure on energy at basic prices (i.e. ex factory price, exclusive of trade margins and taxes on products) per DKK mio. final use of production at basic price from the industry in question. To obtain practical aggregates, expenditure is estimated in units of DKK 10 000, which also implies that multipliers can be interpreted as percentages.

The multiplier contains expenditure on energy, which has incurred in Denmark as well as abroad (via the energy directly and indirectly applied in producing the imported goods, which are directly or indirectly included in the production in question). As there are usually homogeneous trends in energy prices at basic prices among countries, the multiplier can to some extent indicate the sensitivity to changes in energy prices of the production in question. If the multiplier is 5 and there is a general increase in energy prices by 20 pct, and assuming that the increase is completely passed on, prices must be expected to increase by  $0,20 * 5 = 1$  pct.

- (7) As(6), but allowance is not made for the value of the energy content in imports of non-energy goods. This implies that only the value of the energy consumed in Danish territory is covered .

time series* In this context, the discussion in section 6.2 about whether time series should be based on the input-output tables at current or constant prices should be borne in mind. As with earlier chapters, it has been decided to use current price values, when value vis-à-vis value is considered, and constant price value, when quantity vis-à-vis value is considered. In the light of this, the multipliers in tables 7.T.1 to 7.T.4 can only be interpreted over time, while figures in tables 7.T.5 and 7.T.6 can be compared over time as well as among industries and uses.

*Table 7.T.1* Shows the direct energy requirements at TJ per DKK mio. (2000 prices) production value at basic prices of each industry.

*Table 7.T.2* Shows the direct energy requirements at TJ per DKK mio (2000 prices) final use at purchaser's prices. Only the groups with final use that have a direct energy content are included in the table.

*Table 7.T.3* Shows the global energy content at TJ per DKK mio. (2000 prices) final use of production at basic price from each industry. The multiplier contains both the energy quantities applied in Denmark and abroad (via the energy directly and indirectly applied in producing the imported goods, which are directly or indirectly included in the production in question).

Consequently, multipliers of this type reflect the total energy use, caused by a unit of the production in question (i.e. the quantity that can be purchased for DKK 1 mio. at 1995 prices). This type of multiplier is a "technical" multiplier" indicating the total energy intensity, see interpretation of the exogenous model in section 4.1.

*Table 7.T.4* Shows the global energy content at TJ per DKK mio. (2000 prices) final use at purchaser's prices. The interpretation of the multipliers corresponds to the one stated under table 7.T.3.

*Table 7.T.5* Shows the global expenditure on energy at basic prices per DKK mio. (current prices) final use of the production at basic price of each industry. The selection of units implies that the multiplier can be interpreted as the percentage share of total energy expenditure in relation to the price of the product. The multipliers also contain the expenditure on energy abroad assumed to have been incurred via imports.

As there are usually homogeneous trends in energy prices among countries, the multiplier can be interpreted to reflect the price sensitivity of the production in question in relation to changes in energy prices.

*Table 7.T.6* Shows the global expenditure on energy at basic prices per DKK mio. (current prices) final use at purchaser's prices. The interpretation of the multipliers corresponds to the one stated under table 7.T.5.

## 8. Air emissions

This chapter contains input-output related satellite accounts for air emissions. The satellite accounts show emissions from industries and households, causes of the emissions from industries (distributed to causing final use category) and the direct and indirect content of emissions in production and in final use by consumer groups and other categories. In this context, the satellite accounts are shown for 3 different types of emission to air: CO<sub>2</sub>, SO<sub>2</sub> and NO<sub>x</sub>.

Satellite accounts are compiled for 5 additional types of emissions to air: NH<sub>3</sub>, N<sub>2</sub>O and CH<sub>4</sub>, CO and NMVOC, see the NAMEA table in chapter 3, but they are not - owing to consideration of space – shown in this chapter. Similarly, the emission accounts are not shown at the most detailed level. Thus, the distribution, e.g. to different energy types and other sources are left out here. However, it is possible to gain access to these accounts by contacting Statistics Denmark's Division for National Accounts.

### 8.1 Table types

*Table type I - direct emissions from industries and households*

The first table type, I-tables, shows at detailed level the direct emissions from industries and households covering the period 1990, 1995, 2000 and 2004-2007. The NAMEA table in chapter 3 also shows the emissions for 2005 at a general level. While the NAMEA table shows emissions aggregated to 8 industrial main groups, the I-tables show emissions from each of the 130 industries in the national accounts as well as aggregations of the industries at the level of 52- and 26-grouping.

The direct sources of emissions are shown in the emission accounts in table type I. It appears, e.g. that there are large quantities of CO<sub>2</sub> and SO<sub>2</sub> emissions from the energy supply industries, which implies that a large volume of energy is applied in connection with conversion to, e.g. electricity and district heating. Conversely, when data in table type I are compiled, the use of electricity and district heating is considered to be free from emissions.

*Input-output model calculations*

Based on an input-output model, 3 sets of calculations are undertaken for each of the 3 types of emission for 2005. A distribution of emissions by industries and causing final use category is shown in table types II. Table type III shows emission content of production, while table types IV show emission content of final uses.

*Table type II – emissions from industries by final use categories*

The first column in table type II shows total emissions by industries estimated at 1,000 tons (CO<sub>2</sub>) and tons (the other types of emission) and the figures are here identical to those in the columns for 2005 in the I-tables. The next 6 columns show total emissions by industries and causing final demand category: private consumption, government consumption, capital formation in buildings and installations, other capital formation, exports of goods and services and other final uses.

Table type II corresponds to tables 5.F.1 and 6.F.1, where production and employment of industries are analysed by causing final use category. Consequently, the percentage distribution of causing final use of production, employment and different types of emission is also the same at the most detailed level (130 industries). However, this is not the case at a more aggregated level as different weight is attached to each industry when data are aggregated, depending on whether production, employment or emissions are considered.

*Table type III - emission content of production*

Table type III shows the results from the 2005 calculations of the direct and indirect emissions associated with the production by industries and the demand for this production.

A further description of what is meant by direct and indirect content of employment, imports and energy consumption, etc. is given in section 4.2. Direct and indirect emissions are interpreted in the same way.

Column 1 shows direct emissions by industries estimated at 1,000 tons (for CO<sub>2</sub>) or tons (for other emission types). The column corresponds to the “Total” column in table type II and the 2005 column in table type I.

Column 2 shows the share of direct emissions by industries linked to the supplies from industries to final use. For a given industry, data are compiled on the basis of the ratio between value of supplies from the industry to the final use category and production value. The difference between the emissions given in columns 1 and 2 corresponds to the emissions linked to the supplies from industries to other industries of intermediate goods.

Column 3 shows direct emission coefficients by industries estimated as the ratio between direct emissions in column 1 and production value of the industry (table 5.1 shows production value estimated at DKK mio.).

Column 4 shows the direct and indirect *global* emissions estimated at 1,000 tons or tons belonging to Danish final use of production by industries. The total Danish final use of production includes all supplies to final use from Danish as well as foreign industries. In estimating the emissions, both emissions from Denmark and emissions from abroad (directly and indirectly generated in connection with the production of imported goods) are included. Emissions generated via combustion of oil bunkered by Danish ships and air planes abroad are covered by the data given opposite to the water transport industry and the air transport industry. The difference between the data in column 2 and the data in column 4 corresponds to the emissions generated indirectly as a wide range of intermediate goods must be produced by different industries in Denmark and abroad before a given Danish industry can ultimately effect supplies to final use. The statistics on global emissions are compiled from an input-output table with exogenous imports and on the same assumptions as those applied in compiling the global energy content linked to Danish finaluses (see section 4.1 describing assumptions and chapter 7 dealing with the global energy content).

Column 5 shows the direct and indirect *global* emission content per DKK mio. total Danish final demand analysed by Danish and foreign production by industries. For a given industry, the figure in this column is obtained by dividing the corresponding figure in column 4 by the value of total final demand belonging to the industry, as Danish as well as foreign products are included in total demand.

Column 6 shows the direct and indirect *Danish* emission content estimated at 1,000 tons or tons belonging to Danish final use of the production by industries. Unlike the figures in column 4, the demand for goods and services produced abroad is excluded from the calculation.

Column 7 shows the direct and indirect *Danish* emission content per DKK mio. final demand analysed by production by Danish industries. For a given industry, the figure in this column is obtained by dividing the corresponding figure in column 6 by the value of total final demand of Danish products from the industry in question.

*Table type IV -  
emission content  
of final uses*

Table type IV shows the results from the 2005 calculations of the direct and indirect emissions linked to the different types of final use distributed to 73 groups of private consumption, groups of duration, different types of government consumption, capital formation and exports.

Column 1 shows the quantity of emissions estimated at 1,000 tons or tons, which are directly generated in connection with the final use category in question. Direct emissions take place in connection with private consumption of energy goods for heating households and the use of petrol and oil for motor vehicles of households. As the direct emissions in connection with the different groups of private consumption are compiled, inclusive of emissions from the use of energy by foreign tourists in Denmark, these emissions are deducted as a whole from the row for income from tourism. This implies that the direct emissions by Danish households are reflected in the

row for total private consumption. The counterpart of deductions in the row for income from tourism is a corresponding supplement in the row for exports. Subsequently, at the bottom of the table the row for total final use reflects the direct emissions linked to total Danish final use, including the demand from foreign tourist in Denmark.

Column 2 shows the relationship between the direct emissions and value of total Danish final use comprising both Danish and imported products. The column is obtained by dividing figures in column 1 by the figures for total final use appearing in table 5.C.2.

Column 3 shows the direct and indirect *global* emission content estimated at 1,000 tons and tons belonging to total Dansih final use within the categories in question. The compilation of data on total Danish final use includes all supplies to final use of Danish as well as foreign products. In compiling data on emissions, both emissions from Denmark and emissions from abroad (via emissions directly and indirectly generated in connection with the production of imported goods) are included. Emissions generated via combustion of oil bunkered by Danish ships and air planes abroad are covered by the data given opposite to the final use category exports.

Column 4 shows the direct and indirect *global* emission content estimated at DKK mio. total Danish final demand for Danish and foreign products. For a given final use category, the figure in this column is obtained by dividing the corresponding figure in column 3 by the value of total final demand including both Danish and foreign products.

Column 5 shows the direct and indirect *Danish* emission content estimated at 1,000 tons belonging to total Danish final use within the categories in question. The compilation of data on total final use includes all supplies to final use of Danish as well as foreign products. In compiling data on emissions, only emissions generated in Denmark are covered.

Column 6 shows the direct and indirect *Danish* emission content per DKK mio. total Danish final demand of Danish and foreign products. For a given use category, the figure in this column is obtained by dividing the corresponding figure in column 5 by the value of total final demands including both Danish and foreign products.

## 8.2 Statistics on emissions – sources and method

Energy consumption is the principal cause of most types of air emissions, but in compiling data on emissions it is also important to include emissions linked to the various processes undertaken by industries, e.g. manufacturing of cement, bricks and sulphuric acid and emissions linked to the use of fertilizers.

### *Non-energy related emissions*

The statistics on non-energy related emissions are compiled by the Danish National Environmental Research Institute (NERI) in connection with the CORINAIR Database<sup>1</sup>.

### *Energy related emissions*

Statistics on air emissions associated with the combustion of emissions are generally based on calculations of the type: *energy consumption multiplied by technical coefficient*, where energy consumption is estimated, e.g. in terms of GJ, and the technical coefficient reflects the content of pollutant per unit of GJ energy consumption. The technical coefficients are determined on the basis of, e.g. the chemical composition (for example, sulphur or carbon content) of the energy type. For certain emission types (e.g. NO<sub>x</sub>) they are also based on the conditions of combustion. In determining

<sup>1</sup> CORINAIR is a European air emission database established at the initiative of the EU's Council of Ministers. The European Environment Agency (EEA) is responsible for the continued development at European level, while the current updating and maintenance of the Danish part of the database is undertaken by the Danish National Research Institute. The Danish CORINAIR database contains detailed information on energy consumption and emissions factors.

the technical coefficients, attention is paid to the measures which are instrumental in reducing emissions (for example, catalytic converters for cars).

<i>Energy balances</i>	In connection with the emission calculations, information is used from Statistics Denmark's energy balances concerning <i>actual energy consumption</i> (see chapter 7) distributed to different types of energy.
<i>Cars</i>	When emission calculations are conducted, information from the energy balances is supplemented by more detailed information. This applies to, e.g. some background information on which the energy balance is compiled, but which is not published at such a detailed level. An example of this is petrol, LPG and diesel for cars. The detailed data material comprises a distribution of the use of petrol, LPG and diesel to 189 different categories of cars (private cars, vans, lorries, buses, etc.) in each use category.
<i>Emission coefficients</i>	The information on emission coefficients originates from the CORINAIR Database. In some cases, the emission coefficients are calculated on the basis of the chemical composition of the fuel, whereas in other cases, they are based on measurements. The latter applies to, e.g. emissions of SO <sub>2</sub> and NO <sub>x</sub> from power plants
<i>Different accounts</i>	The emissions, which are calculated in accordance with the above-mentioned method, do not fully harmonize with the emissions contained in the CORINAIR Database, which is operated by the Danish National Environmental Research Institute (NERI) in accordance with both ECE guidelines <sup>2</sup> and IPCC guidelines <sup>3</sup> . This is mainly due to differences as regards the statistical sources for energy consumption <sup>4</sup> .
<i>Foreign tourists</i>	In the field of transport, the consumption of petrol and diesel by cars is compiled on the basis of the quantity of fuel sold in Denmark. This implies that purchases of petrol and diesel in Denmark by foreign tourists, including also foreign tourists' border trade in Denmark are covered by the statistics on direct emissions. In connection with compiling statistics on emissions in table types II and IV, the above-mentioned emissions are entered as exports.  Purchases of petrol and diesel abroad by Danish tourists are excluded from the statistics on emissions.

<sup>3</sup> The purpose of the IPCC (Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) guidelines for national statistics on greenhouse gases is to underpin UN's Convention on climate changes (UNFCCC, UN Framework Convention on Climate Change).

### Appendix 3. Explanations of terms used

<i>Actual energy consumption</i>	The total consumption of primary as well as converted types of energy. See also <i>gross energy consumption</i> .
<i>Actual individual consumption</i>	The sum of private consumption and government individual consumption constitutes actual individual consumption. This concept is unaffected by changes over time in the distribution of the expenditure between households and general government.
<i>Basic prices</i>	Basic prices are for domestic production defined as the price ex factory excl. product taxes, net. For imports they are the cif. prices, i.e. the prices of the products at their arrival in Denmark, incl. transport and insurance expenses. Value added (q.v.) may also be defined at basic value.
<i>Bunkering</i>	Refuelling of ships and aeroplanes (typically fuel oil and jet petroleum).
<i>Calorific values</i>	The content of energy in energy products measured in units of energy (GJ) per weight or volume.
<i>Changes in inventories</i>	Comprise an estimate of both raw and finished goods in manufacturing, wholesale and retail trade, including a number of products for which specific information exists, especially about inventories of agricultural products, e.g. the intervention inventories of the European Union.
<i>Compensation of employees</i>	Includes all forms of wages and salaries, also payment by the piece, pay for overtime, bonuses, contributions by both employers and employees to pension and other social schemes. All payments of this type in Denmark are included, irrespective of the nationality of the recipient. When compensation of employees from the rest of the world (net) is added, the total received by employees residing in Denmark is reached.
<i>Consumption by non-residents on the economic territory</i>	The consumption by tourists (non-residents) in Denmark, whether for use in Denmark or elsewhere.
<i>Consumption by residents in the rest of the world</i>	The consumption by Danish residents abroad. The sum of households' consumption on Danish territory and the consumption by residents in ROW less the consumption by non-residents on the economic territory constitutes the consumption by Danish households.
<i>Converted energy</i>	Types of energy (electricity, district heat and town gas), which are a result of conversion processes of fossil fuels, such as coal, oil and natural gas etc.
<i>Cross-border flows of emissions</i>	Airborne im- and exports of polluting substances, e.g. SO <sub>2</sub> , NO <sub>X</sub> and NH <sub>3</sub> .
<i>Direct emissions</i>	Emissions connected to the households' use of energy products for transportation or heating purposes etc.
<i>ESA95</i>	The Danish national accounts are compiled in accordance with the European system of accounts, ESA 1995, which is based on <i>System of National Accounts. Brussels/Luxembourg, New York, Paris, Washington, D.C. 1993</i> (SNA93). The grouping of the industries follows Danish Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities 1993 (DB93), which is based on the nomenclature NACE Rev.1 of the European Union, cf. appendix 1.
<i>Emissions</i>	Emissions to air of polluting substances, e.g. CO <sub>2</sub> (carbon dioxide), SO <sub>2</sub> (sulphur dioxide), NO <sub>X</sub> (nitrogen oxides), CO (carbon monoxide), NH <sub>3</sub> (ammonia), N <sub>2</sub> O (nitrous oxide), CH <sub>4</sub> (methane) and NMVOC (non-methane volatile organic compounds).

<i>Employees</i>	Comprise both salary earners and skilled and unskilled wage earners. The number is compiled according to the same principles as those applied for total employment. The difference between the two concepts constitutes the self-employed (incl. assisting spouses).
<i>Employment</i>	The number of employed persons consists of all those who supply labour to the production of goods and services. In the Danish national accounts employment is subdivided into two groups: (a) wage and salary earners and (b) self-employed (incl. assisting spouses). Please note that in this publication employment is shown excl. of persons on leave.
<i>Environmental themes</i>	Polluting substances are weighed according to their contribution to environmental problems/themes. SO <sub>2</sub> , NO <sub>X</sub> and NH <sub>3</sub> are weighed into an expression of the total contribution to the acidification effect and CO <sub>2</sub> , CH <sub>4</sub> and N <sub>2</sub> O are weighed into an expression of the contribution to the greenhouse gas effect.
<i>Exports</i>	Exports include all commodities (new or used) which, for payment or free, finally leave the Danish economic territory for a destination in the rest of the world. All services provided by resident units to non-resident units are also included.
<i>Financial intermediation services indirectly measured, FISIM</i>	For most producers the value of their production can be measured directly based on the revenue obtained by selling it. When it comes to the producers of certain types of financial intermediary services this practice can only be used for revenues obtained as commissions and fees, but not for revenues obtained by applying a higher interest rate for customer's loans than for their deposits, the so-called interest margin. The part of the payment covered by the interest margin is in the national accounts called Financial Intermediation Services Indirectly Measured, for short FISIM. It is primarily in connection with loans and deposits in banks the payment takes the form of FISIM, while FISIM does not occur in connection with mortgage credit.  In the national accounts FISIM is considered to be like any other produced service, i.e. the total supply, consisting of domestic production and imports, equals total demand, consisting of intermediate consumption, private consumption and exports.
	The present calculation of FISIM in the national accounts is based on the difference between using a reference interest rate and the interest actually paid. While FISIM earlier was recorded as input in a notional industry, and consequently only reduced the total of Gross value added, the present treatment as mentioned records it as input in the industries or as final use.
<i>Fixed capital formation</i>	Fixed capital formation consists of the expenses paid by industries for durables, acquired for use in the production for more than a year, e.g. expenses for acquisition of machinery, furniture and equipment. It may be calculated gross or net, the difference being consumption of fixed capital equipment.
<i>Flaring</i>	Burning of natural gas at drilling platforms without any utilization of the gas.
<i>Global direct and indirect emissions</i>	Includes, compared to the Danish emissions, also direct and indirect emissions caused by foreign production activities which are necessary to comply with the total Danish imports.
<i>Government collective consumption</i>	Expenditure for services of general government used collectively, e.g. defence and the judicial system.
<i>Government individual consumption</i>	Comprises expenditure for services of general government used by individual persons, e.g. many education and health services.

<i>Gross energy consumption</i>	Estimated energy consumption where the converted types of energy are converted into primary energy. The net import of electricity is also converted into primary energy assuming Danish technology of production. The use of, e.g. coal and crude oil, which is used for the production of electricity, etc. is at the same time reset to zero. When calculating the gross energy consumption the losses of energy connected to the conversion are also distributed to the users of the respective types of energy. See also <i>actual energy consumption</i> .
<i>Gross fixed capital formation, GFCF</i>	GFCF consists of expenses in connection with the construction of new buildings (inc. residential), construction and purchase of transport equipment, machinery, software and furniture and equipment. Furthermore the growth in agricultural breeding stock, acquisition of original works of entertainment, culture and art and mineral explorations are also included.
<i>Gross operating surplus and mixed income</i>	Gross operating surplus and mixed income is calculated by subtracting compensation of employees and other production taxes from gross value added. It is consequently the part of income, which is available for compensating the self-employed persons and for consumption of fixed capital equipment (depreciation). For general government it equals the latter, since production here is calculated as the sum of all costs.
<i>Gross value added at 2000 prices</i>	Gross value added at 2000 prices is an indication of the creation of value added by the industries, when changes in prices since 2000 are disregarded. The development in this time series is often seen as an indication of the growth in quantities of net production and consequently for economic growth.
<i>Gross value added at basic prices</i>	For every industry the production at basic prices less intermediate consumption at purchaser's prices constitutes the gross value added of that industry. Consequently, it equals the sum of other production taxes, compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income. Summed up over the industries it constitutes gross domestic product (GDP) at basic prices. For the total of society the concept may also be calculated as GDP at market prices less product taxes, net.
<i>Imports</i>	Comprise partly all commodities (new and used) which, for payment or free, are admitted into the Danish economic territory from the rest of the world and partly all services provided by non-residential units to residential units.
<i>Indirect emissions</i>	Indirect emissions caused by final demand (e.g. private consumption) is the total of all emissions caused by all the production activities necessary to make it possible for the industries to ultimately fulfil the final demand. The indirect emissions also account for the emissions caused by the production of goods which the industries supply to each other.
<i>Industries</i>	The industries of the Danish national accounts are defined according to DB03 (Danish Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities 2003) and consequently comparable with the classification of industries used elsewhere by Statistics Denmark. Appendix 1 shows the connection between the industrial classification of the national accounts and DB03.
<i>Intermediate input</i>	Intermediate input consists of the value of goods and services used for a production process. It does not include the service of fixed assets, since they are recorded as use of fixed capital.
<i>Market prices</i>	Correspond to purchaser's prices (q.v.). This value concept is in the Danish national accounts only used for totals, e.g. GDP at market prices.

<i>Natural emissions</i>	Emissions related to the decomposition of biomass, emissions from wetlands or seeping of gas from the underground.
<i>Non profit institutions serving households, NPISH</i>	Organisations and societies, e.g. cultural, supplying services to households.
<i>Output (production value)</i>	The value of all production by industries, whether for sale or for own use.
<i>Primary factors</i>	The concept primary factor or primary input is really a concept from the world of economic models. It is, nevertheless, used generally in economic theory for compensation of employees and gross operating surplus and mixed income. In the input-output model used for this publication, the indirect taxes (excl. customs duties) paid by industries and their use of unspecified imports are also seen as primary inputs. In the version with imports endogenous, cf. section 2.2, all imports (incl. customs duties) are also considered as such.
<i>Production taxes</i>	Comprise duties on products and other production taxes. The main components of the latter are vehicle excise duties and tax on real estate.
<i>Purchaser's price</i>	The price actually paid by the purchaser for a product. Consequently, this price may, in addition to the factory price of the product, include costs for transportation, trade margins, commodity tax and V.A.T. cf. also market prices.
<i>Reserves</i>	Stocks of, e.g. crude oil and natural gas, which can be extracted by the given technology and under given economic circumstances are realistic to extract.
<i>Satellite accounts</i>	An independent system of accounts based on the definitions and classifications used in the national accounts.
<i>SITC</i>	Standard International Trade Classification, Rev 3 (1988 revision) is the product classification of the United Nations for foreign trade. In this publication the subdivision is: SITC 0 Food, live animals SITC 1 Beverages and tobacco SITC 2 Crude materials, inedible, except fuels SITC 3 Mineral fuels, lubricants, etc. SITC 4 Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes SITC 5 Other chemicals SITC 6 Manufactured goods SITC 7 Machinery and transport equipment SITC 8 Misc. manufactured articles n.e.c. SITC 9 Commodities n.e.s.
<i>Subsidies</i>	Comprise all current transfers from general government to enterprises, i.e. units with market production.
<i>Value added</i>	Cf. Gross value added.
